AN ACT

RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE; APPROPRIAT ING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025; LIM ITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS; PROVID ING REQUIREMENTS REGARDING THE WATERCRAFT INSPECTION PROGRAM; PROVID ING FOR ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS; APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MONEYS
 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE PEST CONTROL DEFICIENCY WARRANT FUND; AND
 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture the following amounts to be expended according to the designated programs and expense classes from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025:

SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519, Idaho Code, the Department of Agriculture is authorized no more than two hundred thirty-one (231.00) full-time equivalent positions at any point during the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, unless specifically authorized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee will be notified promptly of any increased positions so authorized.

SECTION 3. WATERCRAFT INSPECTION PROGRAM. The Department of Agricul-28 ture shall maximize the use of the appropriation provided for the watercraft 29 inspection program to minimize the chances of spreading zebra mussels, 30 guagga mussels, and other aquatic invasive species into Idaho waters. The 31 department is encouraged to use roving inspection stations when appropri-32 ate and to expand hours of coverage during holidays when boat transport 33 traffic is likely to increase. It is also encouraged to use extra staffing 34 35 on busy holiday weekends. The department shall gather data regarding the number of watercraft that are bypassing the stations and nighttime trans-36 port of watercraft across Idaho's borders. The department shall also seek 37 38 to secure federal funding to further enhance invasive species detection and prevention efforts. The department shall report back to the Joint Fi-39 nance-Appropriations Committee, the Senate Agricultural Affairs Committee, 40

and the House Agricultural Affairs Committee during the 2025 legislative
session regarding the results of the data gathering, attainment of federal
funds, and an operational review of the boat stations.

4 SECTION 4. ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS. Funds specifically identified in 5 statute or in an appropriation act as intended for a certain purpose may be 6 used only for that purpose. All funds provided in this act shall be subject 7 to accountability reports and management reviews in accordance with Section 8 67-702, Idaho Code.

9 SECTION 5. DEFICIENCY WARRANT. There is hereby appropriated and the Office of the State Controller shall transfer \$627,900 from the General Fund to the Pest Control Deficiency Warrant Fund as soon as practicable for the period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024. Such moneys shall be used to reimburse costs incurred by the Plant Industries Program in the Department of Agriculture pursuant to Section 22-2019, Idaho Code.

SECTION 6. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, Section 5 of this act shall be in full force and effect on and after passage and approval, and Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 of this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
