5	DEFINE TERMS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
6	DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 24, Title 18, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 18-2403A, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

18-2403A. ORGANIZED RETAIL THEFT. (1) A person is guilty of organized retail theft if the person, in concert with another: commits a violation of section 18-2403, Idaho Code, the subject of the theft is merchandise and the merchandise is taken from a mercantile establishment, and:

- (a) The aggregate amount of the theft or thefts within any ninety (90) day period exceeds one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500);
- (b) The theft or thefts were committed with the intent to resell the merchandise taken, and the aggregate amount of the theft or thefts within any ninety (90) day period exceeds seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750); or
- (c) The person commits two (2) or more violations of section 18-2403, Idaho Code, within a thirty (30) day period, and in committing such thefts, obtains or uses ten (10) or more items of merchandise.
- (2) Any person who pleads guilty to, or is found guilty of, a violation of this section is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment of up to fifteen (15) years, a fine of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), or both such fine and imprisonment.
- (3) The maximum penalties provided for in subsection (2) of this section shall be doubled when the person committing organized retail theft is a manager of the organized retail theft. An individual is a manager of the organized retail theft when that individual knowingly recruits, organizes, supervises, finances, or otherwise manages or directs any other individual or individuals to commit the acts set forth in subsection (1) (a), (b), or (c) of this section.
 - (4) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Merchandise" means any personal property displayed, held, or offered for sale by a merchant.
 - (b) "Mercantile establishment" means any place where merchandise is displayed, held, or offered for sale, either at retail or wholesale.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
