AN ACT

- RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE 2 INTENT; AMENDING TITLE 67, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 3 97, TITLE 67, IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINT-4 5 MENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES, TO PRO-VIDE FOR A TRANSITION PLAN FOR THE OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES, 6 AND TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE OF EARLY 7 CHILDHOOD SERVICES; AMENDING SECTION 67-2601, IDAHO CODE, AS AMENDED BY 8 SECTION 2, CHAPTER 182, LAWS OF 2023, AND BY SECTION 33, CHAPTER 220, 9 10 LAWS OF 2023, TO ESTABLISH THE OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SELF-GOVERNING AGENCIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND 11 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 12
- 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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14 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. (1) It is hereby declared by the Legis-15 lature of the state of Idaho that:

- (a) Early childhood development is directly linked to economic development because it improves the quality of the future workforce and has
 been shown to create cost savings to taxpayers by reducing the need for
 educational remediation, social services, and other government services;
- (b) The deliberate coordination of Idaho's public and private early
 childhood services will allow for greater efficiency, expanded
 parental choice, and allow for a more accurate inventory of existing
 services, programs, and initiatives for use by families and policy mak ers;
- (c) Families should have choices when it comes to services for their
 young children and, if they choose to seek services outside the home,
 should have high-quality options and support for the decision-making
 process;
- (d) The long-term academic success of children is dependent on third
 grade reading proficiency, with a foundation built on the language and
 literacy experiences of children from birth to age five;
- (e) Early childhood services providers offer services that are essen tial to the success of the state, both because of their impact on long term outcomes for children and their impact on the ability of parents to
 participate in the workforce;
- (f) Idaho's successful economy and growing workforce depend on at tracting and retaining families with young children, and such families
 often have limited time and resources to access early childhood ser vices; and
- (g) The state of Idaho seeks to be as efficient as possible in providing
 high-quality early childhood services to make it easy for families and
 providers to thrive.

(2) It is hereby declared that the purposes of this act are to: 1 2 (a) Authorize under the Department of Self-Governing Agencies an office of early childhood services that will provide oversight and sup-3 port to the early childhood system; 4 (b) Support collaboration and coordination with and among all relevant 5 state agencies, local agencies, providers, and families; 6 (c) Facilitate the effective functioning of the early childhood sys-7 tem; 8 Help state government serve families and providers more effi-9 (d) 10 ciently and effectively; (e) Help to maintain access to the early childhood services needed to 11 support child development in the state of Idaho as established by the 12 Governor's Executive Order No. 2019-14; and 13 (f) Help to maintain access to the early childhood services needed to 14 support the state of Idaho's workforce. 15 SECTION 2. That Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended 16 17 by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chapter 97, Title 67, Idaho Code, and to read as follows: 18 19 CHAPTER 97 OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES 20 67-9701. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter, the following terms 21 have the following meanings unless the context indicates otherwise: 22 23 (1) "Child care" means the care and supervision of children. (2) "Director" means the director of the office of early childhood ser-24 25 vices. (3) "Early childhood" means the period of life from birth to five (5) 26 27 years of age, unless otherwise specified. 28 (4) "Early childhood advisory council" or "council" means the state advisory council required by the improving head start for school readiness 29 act, 42 U.S.C. 9837b(b)(1). 30 (5) "early childhood services provider" means an entity that provides 31 32 early childhood services. (6) "Early childhood services" includes child care, early childhood 33 special education, early education, head start, home visiting, and any other 34 similar service meant to support children from birth to five (5) years of age 35 36 and their families. (7) "Early childhood special education" means services provided to 37 children under five (5) years of age pursuant to the federal individuals with 38 disabilities education act, 20 U.S.C. 1400 et seq. 39 (8) "Early education" means any program with a stated purpose of pro-40 moting child development based on the Idaho early learning e-guidelines. 41 (9) "Early learning e-quidelines" means a set of learning standards and 42 43 guidelines maintained by the office that address multiple domains of child development. 44 (10) "Head start" means services provided by early childhood services 45 46 providers pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 9801 et seq.

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(11) "IdahoSTARS" means a program that rates the quality of early childhood services providers and provides support to early childhood services
providers for continuous improvement.

4 (12) "Home visiting" means an evidence-based home visiting service that
5 supports the health and development of pregnant women, expectant fathers,
6 and parents and caregivers of children under five (5) years of age.

7 (13) "Mixed delivery system" means a system of early childhood services
8 delivered through a combination of early childhood services providers that
9 is supported with a combination of public and private funds.

(14) "Office" means the office of early childhood services.

(15) "Oversight" means authority for the budget and administration of a program or service and designation as the lead agency on any issue within that authority.

67-9702. OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES -- APPOINTMENT OF THE DI RECTOR. (1) The director shall be appointed by the governor.

(2) The director may delegate authority to office employees, unlessotherwise prohibited by law.

18 67-9703. OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES -- TRANSITION. (1) The di 19 rector shall support the development of a proposed fiscal year 2026 budget
 20 for the office and shall be available to the legislature to discuss the de 21 velopment of such budget.

(2) The director shall prepare a transition plan that shall be made public by February 1, 2025. The director shall hold at least one (1) public input session to help develop the transition plan and shall conduct at least one (1) public presentation regarding the transition plan in April 2025. The director shall consult with the early childhood advisory council in the development of the transition plan.

(3) The director shall request funds in the state fiscal year 2026 bud get to conduct an external audit of the transition process. If funds are appropriated, the external audit shall be completed by April 1, 2026.

67-9704. OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES -- DUTIES. The office of
 early childhood services is hereby established in the department of self governing agencies as of July 1, 2024. The duties of the office shall in clude:

(1) Oversight of the following early childhood services:

- 36 (a) Child care, including but not limited to the Idaho child care pro-37 gram;
- 38 (b) Early education;

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- 39 (c) Early childhood special education services; and
 - (d) Early childhood services;

41 (2) Statutory authorities previously provided to the department of42 health and welfare pursuant to chapters 11 and 12, title 39, Idaho Code;

- 43 (3) Leading statewide efforts to improve early childhood services and44 strengthen the mixed delivery system;
 - (4) Collaboration and coordination with:
- (a) Other child-serving agencies, including but not limited to the department of health and welfare and the state board of education;

(b) Any other state agencies whose policy responsibilities are related 1 2 to those of the office; and (c) The early childhood advisory council, with the director to serve as 3 chair of the council; 4 (5) Collaboration and coordination with tribal governments to support 5 the delivery of early childhood services; 6 (6) Supporting the work of early childhood services providers; 7 (7) Assisting families who wish to obtain early education services; 8 (8) Ensuring the successful function of the mixed delivery system by 9 conducting the following activities: 10 (a) Working across programs to set terms for service quality to guar-11 antee quality for children and families in a way that is feasible for 12 providers to implement; 13 (b) Measuring and reporting on the quality of service in a way that 14 guarantees accountability, while supporting providers to be success-15 16 ful; (c) Reporting an annual office budget that provides transparency on the 17 state's investment in young children; 18 (d) Implementing a plan for strengthening the workforce of early child-19 20 hood services providers to ensure that talented personnel are being at-21 tracted into the field and are supported to remain in the field; (e) Creating a unified eligibility portal that makes it easy for fami-22 lies to enroll in services; 23 Communicating to the public about the value and availability of 24 (f) early childhood services; 25 26 (q) Leveraging and integrating existing data more effectively to guantify the state's existing early education and care capacity and the 27 needs of families and to mobilize resources to meet those needs; 28 Updating and supporting the implementation of the Idaho early 29 (h) learning e-guidelines; 30 (i) Supporting effective transitions into kindergarten for all chil-31 32 dren; and (j) Supporting effective transitions for all children receiving early 33 childhood special education services, including any changes in ser-34 vices prior to kindergarten entry and the transition into kindergarten; 35 (9) Ensuring that the delivery of early childhood services in Idaho 36 complies with all relevant federal laws and regulations; 37 (10) Applying for public or private funding to carry out the office's 38 39 responsibilities; (11) Providing an annual report on the current status of the early 40 41 childhood services field that utilizes integrated data to provide transparency and accountability for the office's work; and 42 (12) Any other duties assigned by the governor and legislature. 43 SECTION 3. That Section 67-2601, Idaho Code, as amended by Section 2, 44 45 Chapter 182, Laws of 2023, and by Section 33, Chapter 220, Laws of 2023, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: 46 47

47 67-2601. DEPARTMENT CREATED -- ORGANIZATION. (1) There is hereby cre 48 ated the department of self-governing agencies. The department shall, for

the purposes of section 20, article IV of the constitution of the state of Idaho, be an executive department of the state government.

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(2) The department shall consist of the following:

(a) Agricultural commodity commissions: Idaho apple commission, as 4 provided by chapter 36, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho bean commission, 5 as provided by chapter 29, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho beef council, as 6 provided by chapter 29, title 25, Idaho Code; Idaho cherry commission, 7 as provided by chapter 37, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho dairy products 8 commission, as provided by chapter 31, title 25, Idaho Code; Idaho pea 9 10 and lentil commission, as provided by chapter 35, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho potato commission, as provided by chapter 12, title 22, Idaho 11 Code; Idaho wheat commission, as provided by chapter 33, title 22, Idaho 12 Code; and Idaho alfalfa and clover seed commission, as provided in chap-13 ter 42, title 22, Idaho Code. 14

(b) The board of commissioners of the Idaho state bar, as provided bychapter 4, title 3, Idaho Code.

(c) The board of examiners, pursuant to section 67-2001, Idaho Code.

(d) The division of veterans services, to be headed by a division ad-18 ministrator who shall be a nonclassified employee exempt from the pro-19 20 visions of chapter 53, title 67, Idaho Code. The administrator of the 21 division shall administer the provisions of chapter 2, title 65, Idaho Code, and chapter 9, title 66, Idaho Code, with the advice of the vet-22 erans affairs commission established under chapter 2, title 65, Idaho 23 Code, and shall perform such additional duties as are imposed upon him 24 by law. 25

(e) The board of library commissioners, pursuant to section 33-2502,
Idaho Code.

(f) The Idaho state historical society, pursuant to section 67-4123,Idaho Code.

(g) The office of the state appellate public defender, pursuant to
 chapter 59, title 19, Idaho Code, and the office of the state public
 defender, pursuant to chapter 60, title 19, Idaho Code.

(h) The division of occupational and professional licenses, which ishereby created.

35 (i) The office of administrative hearings, pursuant to section
 36 67-5280, Idaho Code.

37 (j) The office of early childhood services, pursuant to chapter 97, ti 38 tle 67, Idaho Code.

(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the
governor shall have the authority to assign entities listed in subsection
(2) of this section to divisions, sections, or units in such a manner as will
tend to provide an orderly arrangement in the administrative organization of
state government.

SECTION 4. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after
 July 1, 2024.
