7	67-5345, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE REQUIREMENTS FOR SALARY ADJUSTMENTS AND
8	SAVINGS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 53, Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 67-5344, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 67-5344. STATE EMPLOYEE TELEWORK -- REQUIREMENTS -- PROHIBITION. (1) Every state department listed in section 67-2402(1), Idaho Code, including every state agency organized under such departments, shall be subject to the provisions of this section.
- (2) In-office employees shall work in state offices at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their scheduled workdays during a two (2) week pay cycle. During the remaining twenty-five percent (25%) of their scheduled work days, state departments or agencies may approve an in-office employee for telework as long as that employee complies with the state telework policy.
- (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, in-office employees with job responsibilities that require direct contact with the public through in-person or phone interactions shall not be eligible for telework.
- (4) In-office employees, except those employees who are identified in subsection (3) of this section, may be exempted from the provisions of subsection (2) of this section if:
 - (a) There are no state offices within fifty (50) miles of the employee's home address;
 - (b) The employee works in a job classification designated through rule and approved by the legislature for telework; or
 - (c) The employee has requested and been approved for telework as an accommodation for a documented illness or disability.
- (5) Telework requires an employee to enter into a telework agreement. Failure to comply with any aspect of such telework agreement shall void the agreement and preclude the employee from participating in another telework agreement for three (3) years. A telework agreement shall be reviewed at least annually and shall be reviewed when the circumstances providing an in-office employee with exempted status pursuant to the provisions of subsection (4) of this section change or may have changed. A telework agreement shall include:

- (a) Department or agency approval of an identified telework location, which shall be specified by address and shall be a private space. Public locations or spaces shared with members of the public shall not qualify; and
- (b) Acknowledgment that the employee:

- (i) Shall comply with information technology security protocols during telework. Any approved telework location shall comply with all of the requirements of such protocols;
- (ii) Is responsible for any costs associated with physical facilities and communication resources required for telework;
- (iii) Shall remain available at the designated telework location and in communication during regular work hours;
- (iv) Shall follow time-entry guidelines;
- (v) Shall complete telework training prior to final agreement approval; and
- (vi) Shall not provide dependent care during telework without prior approval from the employee's department director or agency administrator.
- (6) Field employees are exempt from the provisions of this section.
- (7) For purposes of this section:
- (a) "Field employee" means any state employee whose ordinary day-to-day responsibilities require work to be completed outside of an office setting or in the field. Examples of field employees include but are not limited to Idaho fish and game wardens, Idaho department of health and welfare social workers, staff working at state parks, and Idaho state department of agriculture inspectors.
- (b) "In-office employee" means any state employee whose day-to-day responsibilities require work primarily in an office setting.
- (c) "Telework" means work performed by an in-office employee outside of a state office property during regular office hours.
- SECTION 2. That Chapter 53, Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 67-5345, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
- 67-5345. REQUIREMENTS -- SALARY ADJUSTMENTS AND SAVINGS. (1) Except in individual circumstances provided for by the requirements of this chapter, employee salary increases awarded as a result of additional funding provided by the legislature shall take effect on July 1 of the year of such appropriation.
- (2) Agencies shall track salary savings and shall use such savings for personnel costs in the same fiscal year as such funds were appropriated or else return such moneys to the general fund. For the purposes of this section, "salary savings" means the difference between an amount appropriated for an agency's personnel budget and the agency's actual personnel costs.
- (3) The transfer of appropriated personnel costs for fiscal year 2025 shall not be transferred to other categories during that fiscal year.
- SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
