3	ELECTIONEERING AT CERTAIN POLLING PLACES, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EXCEP-
4	TIONS, TO PROVIDE PROVISIONS FOR ENFORCEMENT, AND TO REVISE PROVISIONS
5	REGARDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
7	SECTION 1. That Section 18-2318, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
8	amended to read as follows:
9	18-2318. ELECTIONEERING AT POLLS PROHIBITED. (1) On the day of any
10	primary, general or special election, no person may, within a polling place,
11	or any building in which an election is being held, or within one hundred
12	(100) feet thereof: In order to protect the freedom of voters to exercise
13	their franchise without interference or intimidation and to ensure the
14	administration of an election at any polling place is undisturbed, the pro-
15	visions of this section shall apply on any day that ballots are being cast in
16	person for any election.
17	(2) (a) No person may, within a polling place, within any building in
18	which an election is being held, or within two hundred fifty (250) feet
19	of the primary entrance and exit used by voters at a polling place or
20	<pre>other voting location:</pre>
21	(a) (i) Do any electioneering;
22	(b) (ii) Circulate cards or handbills of any kind;
23	(c) (iii) Solicit signatures to any kind of petition; or
24	(iv) Advocate for or against any candidate or measure;
25	(v) Solicit votes in any manner or by any means;
26	(vi) Give or offer to give any money or gifts; or
27	(d) (vii) Engage in any practice which that interferes with the
28	freedom of voters to exercise their franchise or disrupts the ad-
29	ministration of the polling place.
30	(b) The restrictions set forth in this subsection shall not apply to
31	conduct occurring on private property located adjacent to a building
32	designated as a polling place.
33	(2) (3) No person may obstruct the doors or entries to a building in
34	which a polling place is located or prevent free access to and from any
35	polling place.

(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit poll workers and elections officials from being physically present at a voting location,

hereby authorized, and it is hereby made the duty of such officer, to arrest

any person violating the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of this sec-

tion, and such offender shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-

(3) Any election officer, sheriff, constable or other peace officer is

<u>distributing material that is necessary to instruct electors</u>, or <u>distributing materials</u> prepared by the secretary of state or by the county clerk.

- (5) Any election official may take the necessary steps to address electioneering, including but not limited to the removal of physical materials, addressing individuals deemed to be electioneering, or contacting law enforcement.
- $\underline{\text{(6)}}$ The first two (2) violations of this section by a person shall be deemed an infraction punishable by a fine in the amount of three hundred dollars (\$300) for each such violation. Any person who violates this section three (3) or more times is guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
