8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. As it is declared in Idaho Code, public officials serving at any level of government do so in the public trust. To maintain such a trust, it is crucial that those who are elected serve in the government with integrity, maintain a high standard of principles, and not discredit public office. Elected officials must serve as examples for the people being governed. The public trust is lost when elected public officials, who are expected to represent the community, violate criminal law.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 4, Title 74, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 74-408, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 74-408. ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIAL -- CRIMINAL CONVICTION. (1) Any elected official of a governmental entity or any person appointed to a vacant elected office of a governmental entity convicted of a crime resulting in probation or incarceration in a correctional facility, local correctional facility, or private correctional facility, as those terms are defined in section 18-101A, Idaho Code, shall no longer be eligible to be elected to any public office within the state of Idaho.
- (2) Any elected public official found to be in violation of this section may complete his term of office.

SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
