44 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

1 SECTION 1. That Section 1-2220, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 2 amended to read as follows:

1-2220. RETENTION OR NONRETENTION OF MAGISTRATE BY VOTE. Any magis-3 4 trate appointed pursuant to the provisions of section 1-2205, Idaho Code, and section 1-2207(2), Idaho Code, shall stand for office in the first gen-5 eral election next succeeding the expiration of the eighteen (18) month 6 period established pursuant to section 1-2207, Idaho Code. Any magistrate 7 may, not less than ninety (90) days prior to the holding of the general elec-8 tion next preceding the expiration of his term of office, during the time 9 10 period provided in section 34-1404, Idaho Code, file in the office of the county clerk of the county for which he is a resident magistrate, accompa-11 nied by a filing fee of forty dollars (\$40.00), a declaration of candidacy 12 to succeed himself. If a declaration is not so filed by any magistrate, the 13 vacancy resulting from the expiration of his term of office shall be filled 14 15 by appointment as herein provided, except that any magistrate who does not file shall be ineligible for appointment within the same judicial district 16 until for two (2) years following the expiration of his last term of office 17 have expired. If such a declaration is filed, his name shall be submitted at 18 19 the next general election to the voters eligible to vote within the county 20 for which he is appointed, on a nonpartisan judicial ballot, without party designation, which shall read: 21

"Shall Magistrate .... (Here insert the name of the magistrate) of .... (Here insert the name of the county) County of the .... (Here insert the judicial district number) Judicial District be retained in office?" (Here provision is to be made for voting "Yes" or "No..."...)

The votes shall be canvassed as provided in chapter 12, title 34, Idaho Code.

If a majority of those voting on the question vote against retaining him in office, upon the expiration of his term of office, a vacancy shall exist which shall be filled by appointment as provided in section 1-2205, Idaho Code, except that the magistrate not retained in office shall be ineligible for appointment within the same judicial district until for two (2) years following the expiration of his last term of office have expired.

If a majority of those voting on the question vote for retaining him in office, the county clerk shall issue him a certificate of election as provided in section 34-1209, Idaho Code, and said magistrate shall, unless removed for cause, remain in office for an additional term of four (4) years, and at the expiration of each such four (4) year term shall be eligible for retention in office by election in the manner herein prescribed.

41 SECTION 2. That Section 31-4306, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 42 amended to read as follows:

31-4306. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS. (1) An election of directors shall be
held in each district on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November
of each odd-numbered year. Such election shall be held in conformity with
title 34, Idaho Code. Before the notice of election is given, the board shall
divide the district into subdivisions as nearly equal in population as possible to be designated as director's subdistrict 1, 2 and 3, or director's

subdistrict 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, depending <u>upon on</u> the number of subdistricts in the district. Each nominating petition shall state the subdistrict for which the nominee is nominated.

(2) In any election for directors if, after the expiration of the date 4 5 for filing written nominations for the office of director, it appears that only one (1) qualified candidate has been nominated for each position to be 6 7 filled and if no declaration of intent has been filed as provided in subsection (3) of this section, it shall not be necessary to hold an election, and 8 the board of directors shall, no later than seven (7) days before the sched-9 uled date of the election, declare such candidate elected as director, and 10 11 the secretary of the recreation district board shall immediately make and deliver to such person a certificate of election. 12

(3) No write-in vote for recreation district director shall be counted
unless a declaration of intent has been filed indicating that the person
desires the office and is legally qualified to assume the duties of recreation district director if elected. The declaration of intent shall be filed
with the recreation district board secretary not later than forty-five (45)
days before the day of election during the time period provided in section
34-1407, Idaho Code.

20 SECTION 3. That Section 33-2717A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 21 amended to read as follows:

33-2717A. DECLARATION OF INTENT FOR WRITE-IN CANDIDATE. No write-in 22 23 vote for library district trustee in a library district election shall be counted unless a declaration of intent has been filed indicating that the 24 person desires the office and is legally qualified to assume the duties of 25 26 library trustee if elected. The declaration of intent shall be filed with the clerk of the library board not later than forty-five (45) days before the 27 day of election during the time period provided in section 34-1407, Idaho 28 Code. 29

30 SECTION 4. That Section 34-106, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 31 amended to read as follows:

32 34-106. LIMITATION UPON ON ELECTIONS. On and after January 1, 2011, 33 notwithstanding any other provisions of the law to the contrary, there shall 34 be no more than two (2) elections conducted in any county in any calendar 35 year, except as provided in this section or section 34-220, Idaho Code, and 36 except that elections to fill vacancies in the United States house of repre-37 sentatives shall be held as provided in the governor's proclamation.

- (1) The dates on which elections may be conducted are:(a) The third Tuesday in May of each year; and
- 39 40

(b) The Tuesday following the first Monday in November of each year.

(c) In addition to the elections specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) of
this subsection and subsection (7) of this section, an emergency election may be called upon motion of the governing board of a political subdivision. An emergency exists when there is a great public calamity,
such as an extraordinary fire, flood, storm, epidemic, or other disaster, or when it is necessary to do emergency work to prepare for national
or local defense or to safeguard life, health or property.

(2) Candidates for office elected in May shall take office on the date
specified in the certificate of election but not more than sixty (60) days
following the election.

4 (3) Candidates for office elected in November shall take office as pro5 vided in the constitution or on January 1 next succeeding the November elec6 tion.

7 (4) The governing board of each political subdivision subject to the 8 provisions of this section that, prior to January 1, 2011, conducted an elec-9 tion for members of that governing board on a date other than a date permit-10 ted in subsection (1) of this section shall establish as the election date 11 for that political subdivision the date authorized in subsection (1) of this 12 section that falls nearest the date on which elections were previously con-13 ducted, unless another date is established by law.

(5) The secretary of state is authorized to provide such assistance as
 necessary and to prescribe any needed rules or interpretations for the con duct of <u>an</u> election authorized under the provisions of this section.

(6) Water districts governed by chapter 6, title 42, Idaho Code, are exempt from the provisions of this section.

(7) Community colleges governed by chapter 21, title 33, Idaho Code,
and school districts are subject to the limitations specified in subsection
(1) of this section, except that school districts may also hold an election
on the last Tuesday in August of each year on bonded indebtedness and property tax levy questions.

(8) A city initiative or referendum election shall be held on the Tues-24 day following the first Monday in November of odd-numbered years. A county 25 initiative or referendum election or a bond, levy and any other ballot ques-26 tion elections conducted by any political subdivision shall be held on the 27 nearest date authorized in subsection (1) of this section that falls more 28 than sixty (60) days at least ten (10) Fridays after the clerk of the polit-29 ical subdivision orders that such election shall be held in May or November 30 of even-numbered years or more than fifty (50) days after the order for all 31 other elections, unless otherwise provided by law. Ballot language for any 32 question to be placed on the ballot shall be submitted to the county clerk at 33 least sixty (60) days before an election held in May or November of even-num-34 bered years and at least fifty (50) days before all other elections not later 35 than 5:00 p.m. on the tenth Friday before the election. 36

(9) Recall elections may be held on any of the three (3) dates autho rized in subsections (1) and (7) of this section that fall more than forty five (45) days at least ten (10) Fridays after the clerk of the political sub division orders that such election shall be held.

(10) Irrigation districts governed by title 43, Idaho Code, are subject
to the limitations specified in subsection (1) of this section, except that
irrigation districts may also hold an election on the first Tuesday in February of each year and on the first Tuesday in August of each year on questions
required to be voted upon on by title 43, Idaho Code.

46 SECTION 5. That Section 34-625, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 47 amended to read as follows:

48 34-625. ELECTION OF HIGHWAY DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS IN SINGLE COUNTY 49 WIDE DISTRICTS -- QUALIFICATIONS. (1) In each general election, highway dis-

trict commissioners in single countywide districts shall be elected as provided for in section 40-1404, Idaho Code.

(2) No person shall be elected to the office of highway district commissioner unless he shall have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years at the
time of his election, is a citizen of the United States, and shall be a resident of the highway district commissioner's subdistrict for which he seeks
office.

8 (3) Each candidate shall file a declaration of candidacy with the
 9 county clerk not less than ninety (90) days prior to the general election
 10 during the time period provided in section 34-1404, Idaho Code. Each dec 11 laration of candidacy shall also bear the following words: "I am a resident
 12 within the boundaries of Highway District Commissioner's Subdistrict Number
 13 ....."

(4) Each candidate who files a declaration of candidacy shall at the
same time pay a filing fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) which shall be deposited in
the county current expense fund.

17 SECTION 6. That Section 34-625A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 18 amended to read as follows:

34-625A. ELECTION OF HIGHWAY DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS IN CERTAIN SINGLE
 COUNTYWIDE DISTRICTS -- QUALIFICATIONS. (1) In each general election, high way district commissioners in single countywide districts shall be elected
 as provided for in section 40-1404A, Idaho Code.

(2) No person shall be elected to the office of highway district commissioner unless he shall have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years at the
time of his election, is a citizen of the United States, and shall be a resident of the highway district commissioner's subdistrict for which he seeks
office.

(3) Each candidate shall file a declaration of candidacy with the
 county clerk not less than ninety (90) days prior to the general election
 during the time period provided in section 34-1404, Idaho Code. Each dec laration of candidacy shall also bear the following words: "I am a resident
 within the boundaries of Highway District Commissioner's Subdistrict Number
 ....."

34 (4) Each candidate who files a declaration of candidacy shall at the
 35 same time pay a filing fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) which shall be deposited in
 36 the county current expense fund.

37 SECTION 7. That Section 34-704, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 38 amended to read as follows:

DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY. (1) Any person legally qualified to 34-704. 39 hold such office is entitled to become a candidate and file his declaration 40 of candidacy. Each political party candidate for precinct, state, district 41 42 or county office shall file his declaration of candidacy in the proper office between 8:00 a.m. on the twelfth Monday preceding the primary election 43 and 5:00 p.m. on the tenth Friday beginning at 8:00 a.m. on the twelfth Mon-44 45 day prior to the primary election and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the tenth Friday before the election preceding the primary election. All political 46 party candidates shall declare their party affiliation in their declaration 47

of candidacy and shall be affiliated with a party at the time of filing. A
candidate shall be deemed affiliated with the political party if the candidate submits a party affiliation form along with the declaration of candidacy to the filing official. The filing official shall reject any declaration of candidacy for partisan office in a primary election from candidates
who are not affiliated with a political party. Candidates for nonpartisan
office shall file during the period provided for in this section.

8 (2) Candidates who file a declaration of candidacy under a party name
9 and are not nominated at the primary election shall not be allowed to appear
10 on the general election ballot under any other political party name, nor or
11 as an independent candidate.

(3) Independent candidates shall file their declaration of candidacyin the manner provided in section 34-708, Idaho Code.

(4) All information in declarations of candidacy shall be made publicly
available upon request, except that the Idaho residential street address and
telephone number of a judicial officer may be exempt from disclosure pursuant to sections 19-6002 19-6202 and 74-106(30), Idaho Code.

18 SECTION 8. That Section 34-705, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 19 amended to read as follows:

34-705. WITH WHOM DECLARATIONS FILED. (1) All candidates for county offices, whether political party candidates or independent candidates, and all political party candidates for precinct offices shall file their declarations of candidacy with the county clerk of their respective counties. All candidates for district, state and federal offices shall file their declarations of candidacy with the secretary of state.

(2) The secretary of state shall certify to the county clerks, within
 ten (10) seven (7) days after the filing deadline, the names of the political
 party candidates who filed for federal, state and district, state, and fed eral offices and are qualified for placement on the ballot.

30 (3) The secretary of state shall certify the name of a candidate being
31 appointed by the appropriate central committee pursuant to section 34-714,
32 Idaho Code, by no later than the next business day after the appointment is
33 received in the secretary of state's office, if received after the certifi34 cation of candidates to the county clerks under subsection (2) of this sec35 tion.

36 SECTION 9. That Section 34-712, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 37 amended to read as follows:

34-712. SAMPLE FORM FOR PRIMARY ELECTION BALLOTS. The secretary of 38 state shall provide the sample form of the primary election ballot to each 39 of the county clerks no later than forty (40) days prior to the primary no 40 later than the ninth Friday before the primary election. The sample ballot 41 42 shall contain the proper political party candidates to be voted upon within the county whose declarations were filed and certified in the office of the 43 secretary of state with instructions for the placing of political party 44 45 candidates seeking the political party nomination for county and precinct offices. If a county is within more than one (1) legislative district, the 46

secretary of state shall provide a sample ballot for each legislative district which that includes part of the county.

3 SECTION 10. That Section 34-717, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 4 amended to read as follows:

5 34-717. WITHDRAWAL OF CANDIDACY. (1) A candidate for nomination or 6 candidate for election to a partisan office may withdraw from the election 7 by filing a notarized statement of withdrawal with the officer with whom his 8 declaration of candidacy was filed. The statement must contain all informa-9 tion necessary to identify the candidate and the office sought and the reason 10 for withdrawal. The filing officer shall immediately notify the proper cen-11 tral committee of the party, if any, of the individual withdrawing.

12 (2) A candidate may not withdraw later than forty-five (45) days be-13 fore an election, except in the case of a primary election, when the deadline 14 shall be no later than the eighth Friday preceding the primary election, or 15 a general election, when the deadline shall be no later than September 7 5:00 16 p.m. on the ninth Friday preceding the election. Filing fees paid by the 17 candidate shall not be refunded.

(2) (3) Any candidate who has filed a statement of withdrawal pursuant
 to this section shall not be allowed to be appointed to fill a vacancy unless
 such vacancy occurs because of the death of a previous candidate.

21 SECTION 11. That Section 34-1205, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 22 amended to read as follows:

34-1205. COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS -- MEETINGS. The county board of
 commissioners shall be the county board of canvassers and the county clerk
 shall serve as their its secretary for this purpose. The county board of can vassers shall meet within seven (7) ten (10) days after a primary election
 and within ten (10) days after a general an election for the purpose of can vassing the election returns of all precincts within the county.

29 SECTION 12. That Section 34-1211, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 30 amended to read as follows:

34-1211. STATE BOARD OF CANVASSERS -- MEETINGS. The secretary of 31 32 state, state controller and state treasurer shall constitute the state board of canvassers. The functions of the board shall be election functions, and 33 the secretary of state shall be chairman of the board. The state board of 34 canvassers shall meet within fifteen (15) twenty-one (21) days after the 35 primary election and within fifteen (15) twenty-one (21) days after the 36 37 general election in the office of the secretary of state for the purpose of canvassing the abstracts of votes cast for all candidates for federal, state 38 and district offices. 39

40 SECTION 13. That Section 34-1404, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 41 amended to read as follows:

42 34-1404. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY. (1) Candidates for election in any
 43 political subdivision shall be nominated by nominating petitions, each of

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which shall bear the name of the nominee, the office for which the nomina-1 2 tion is made, the term for which nomination is made, and the signature of not less than five (5) electors of the candidate's specific zone or district of 3 the political subdivision  $\tau$  and shall be filed with the clerk of the political 4 5 subdivision.

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The form of the nominating petition shall be as provided by the (2) 7 county clerk and shall be uniform for all political subdivisions.

(3) For an election to be held on the third Tuesday in May, in even-num-8 bered years, the The nomination petition shall be filed during the period 9 specified in section 34-704, Idaho Code beginning at 8:00 a.m. on the 10 11 twelfth Monday prior to the election and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the tenth Friday preceding such election. The clerk of the political subdivision 12 shall notify the county clerk within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt of the 13 filing and verify the qualifications of the nominees and shall, no more than 14 seven (7) days after the close of filing, certify the nominees to be placed 15 16 on the ballot of the political subdivision. For an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November, in even-numbered years, 17 the nomination shall be filed on or before September 1. The clerk of the 18 political subdivision shall verify the qualifications of the nominees and 19 shall, no more than seven (7) days after the close of filing, certify the nom-20 21 inces to be placed on the ballot of the political subdivisions. For all other elections, the nomination shall be filed not later than 5:00 p.m. on the 22 ninth Friday preceding the election for which the nomination is made. The 23 clerk of the political subdivision shall verify the qualifications of the 24 nominee and shall, no more than seven (7) days following the filing, certify 25 the nominees to be placed on the ballot of the political subdivision. 26

(2) (4) Nominating petitions shall include campaign contact informa-27 tion for candidates, including phone numbers and email addresses. 28

(3) (5) All information in nominating petitions shall be made publicly 29 available upon request. 30

31 SECTION 14. That Section 34-1405A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: 32

34-1405A. WITHDRAWAL OF CANDIDACY. A candidate for nomination or can-33 didate for election to an office may withdraw from the election by filing a 34 notarized statement of withdrawal with the officer with whom his declaration 35 of candidacy was filed. The statement must contain all information neces-36 sary to identify the candidate and the office sought and the reason for with-37 drawal. A candidate may not withdraw later than forty-six (46) days 5:00 38 p.m. on the ninth Friday before an election. 39

SECTION 15. That Section 34-1407, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 40 amended to read as follows: 41

42 34-1407. WRITE-IN CANDIDATES. (1) No write-in candidate for any nonpartisan elective office shall be counted unless a declaration of intent has 43 been filed indicating that the person desires the office and is legally qual-44 45 ified to assume the duties of the office. The declaration of intent shall be filed with the clerk of the political subdivision by no later than 5:00 p.m. 46 on the eighth ninth Friday before the date of the election. 47

If the statutes governing elections within a specific political 1 (2) 2 subdivision provide that no election shall be held in the event that no more than one (1) candidate has filed for an office, that statute shall be inter-3 preted in such a manner as to allow for filing a declaration of intent for a 4 5 write-in candidate until 5:00 p.m. on the eighth ninth Friday preceding the election. However, if no candidate has filed within that time, no election 6 7 shall be held for that political subdivision. The provisions of this section shall not apply to candidates in the primary or general election covered by 8 the provisions of section 34-702A, Idaho Code. 9

SECTION 16. That Section 40-1305C, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

12 40-1305C. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY -- QUALIFICATIONS. (1) Candidates for election as a highway district commissioner shall be nominated by nomi-13 nating petitions, each of which shall bear the name of the nominee, the sub-14 district for which the nomination is made, the term for which nomination is 15 16 made, bear the signature of not no less than five (5) electors of the candidate's specific subdistrict, and be filed with the election official of the 17 highway district. The form of the nominating petition shall be as provided 18 by the county clerk. The nomination shall be filed not later than 5:00 p.m. 19 on the sixth Friday preceding the election for which the nomination is made 20 21 during the time period provided in section 34-1404, Idaho Code. The election official shall The clerk of the political subdivision shall notify the 22 county clerk within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt of the filing and ver-23 ify the qualifications of the nominee, and shall not no more than seven (7) 24 days following the filing shall certify the nominees to be placed on the bal-25 26 lot.

(2) A nominee shall qualify for the office of highway district commis-sioner if such nominee:

- (a) Has attained the age of twenty-one (21) years at the time of hiselection; and
  - (b) Is a citizen of the United States; and

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32 (c) Is a resident of the highway district commissioner's subdistrict33 for which he seeks office.

34 SECTION 17. That Section 42-3211a, Idaho Code, be, and the same is 35 hereby repealed.

36 SECTION 18. That Section 50-407, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 37 amended to read as follows:

50-407. FORM OF DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY. Declarations of candidacy and petitions of candidacy shall read substantially as herein set forth. Any number of separate petitions of candidacy may be circulated at the same time for any candidate and all petitions for each candidate shall be considered one (1) petition when filed with the city clerk. Each signer of a petition shall be a registered qualified elector.

50-410. TIME AND MANNER OF FILING DECLARATIONS. (1) All declarations 20 21 of candidacy for elective city offices shall be filed with the clerk of the respective city wherein the elections are to be held not earlier than 8:00 22 a.m. on the eleventh Monday nor later than 5:00 p.m. on the ninth Friday, 23 immediately preceding election day during the time period provided in sec-24 tion 34-1404, Idaho Code. Before a candidate files a petition of candidacy 25 with the city clerk, the petition signatures shall be verified by the county 26 27 clerk in the manner described in section 34-1807, Idaho Code, except that the 28 city clerk shall stand in place of the secretary of state. Before any declaration of candidacy and filing fee or petition of candidacy mentioned in 29 section 50-407, Idaho Code, can be filed, the city clerk shall ascertain that 30 it conforms to the provisions of chapter 4, title 50, Idaho Code. The city 31 32 clerk shall not accept any declarations of candidacy after 5:00 p.m. on the ninth Friday immediately preceding election day. Write-in candidates shall 33 be governed by section 34-702A 34-1407, Idaho Code, but shall file the decla-34 rations required in that section with the city clerk. 35

36 (2) A person shall not be permitted to file a declaration of candidacy37 for more than one (1) office in any city election.

38 SECTION 20. That Section 67-4911, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 39 amended to read as follows:

40 67-4911. ELECTIONS -- TERMS OF OFFICE. (1) On an election date as pro-41 vided for in section 34-106(1), Idaho Code, in May of the first odd-numbered 1 year after the organization of any district, and every second year there-2 after, an election shall be held, which shall be known as the biennial elec-3 tion of the district.

(2) At the first biennial election in any district hereafter organized, 4 5 and each sixth year thereafter, there shall be elected by the qualified electors of the district, one (1) member of the board to serve for a term of six 6 7 (6) years; at the second biennial election and each sixth year thereafter, there shall be elected two (2) members of the board to serve for terms of six 8 (6) years, and at the third biennial election, and each sixth year there-9 after, there shall be elected two (2) members of the board to serve for terms 10 11 of six (6) years. Provided, a member of the board once in office shall serve until his successor is elected, qualified and takes office. 12

(3) Not later than 5:00 p.m. on the ninth Friday before any such elec-13 tion, nominations may be filed with the secretary of the board. Nominations 14 may be filed during the time period provided in section 34-1404, Idaho Code. 15 16 The county clerk shall provide for holding such election and shall appoint judges to conduct it. The county clerk shall give notice of election by pub-17 lication, and shall arrange such other details in connection therewith. Ad-18 equate polling places shall be provided throughout the district boundaries 19 20 for all elections.

21 (4) The returns of the election shall be certified to and shall be 22 canvassed and declared by the board of county commissioners which shall 23 report the results to the district. The candidate or candidates, according 24 to the number of directors to be elected, receiving the most votes, shall 25 be elected. Any new member of the board shall qualify in the same manner as 26 members of the first board qualify.

(5) In any election for director, if after the deadline for filing a 27 declaration of intent as a write-in candidate<sub> $\tau$ </sub> it appears that the number of 28 qualified candidates who have been nominated is equal to the number of di-29 rectors to be elected, it shall not be necessary for the candidates to stand 30 for election  $\tau$  and the board shall declare such candidates elected as direc-31 tors  $\tau$  and the secretary of the board shall immediately make and deliver to 32 such persons certificates of election signed by him and bearing the seal of 33 the district. 34

35 SECTION 21. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby 36 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after 37 July 1, 2024.
