benefits under any provision of the social security act. For a subsequent copy of the patient's medical records in one (1) calendar year, provided that no additional medical services have been rendered, a health care provider may charge the allowable rate pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

- (4) Any request made pursuant to this section shall be fulfilled within thirty (30) days in electronic format, if available.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
