Chairman Mendive called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

MOTION: Rep. Nelson made a motion to approve the January 25, 2024 meeting minutes.

MOTION: Rep. Durrant made a motion to approve the January 23, 2024 meeting minutes.

H 402: Rep. Nelson, District 26, presented H 402 explaining this is an agency bill from

Idaho Dept. of Water Resources (IDWR). The legislation removes Class II injection well language from Idaho Code. He introduced **Tim Luke**, Compliance Bureau Chief at IDWR, who briefly explained what injection wells are, and most of the changes are "clean ups" to code and clarification of language. Additionally, other

pertinent agencies have been consulted pertaining to these changes.

There was a committee question as to wether or not this would limit natural gas or oil production in any way and it was explained that production wells are a separate

matter and permitted by a different agency.

MOTION: Rep. Raybould made a motion to send H 402 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelson will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

H 404: Rep. Petzke, District 21, presented HB 404 and explained that the intention behind

this legislation is to expand the protections afforded to endangered species under public records requests to all monitored wildlife. The legislation prevents requestors from getting exact location data on wildlife species of interest thus creating a unfair sportsman advantage among other things. He illustrated the different ways individuals and organizations use public records requests to obtain wildlife tracking and location information for varying purposes and how it creates unintended

consequences and unsafe exposure for wildlife.

Ellary Tucker Williams with Idaho Dept. of Fish and Game, and Bill London with

the Idaho Wild Sheep Association spoke out in support of H 404.

MOTION: Rep. Blanksma made a motion to send HB 404 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Petzke will sponsor the bill

on the floor.
