Chairman Crane (13) called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

RS 31058: Rep. Gallagher presented RS 31058 explaining the purpose of this proposed

legislation is to prevent the State of Idaho and its subsidiaries from mandating the use of face masks or face shields to prevent or slow the spread of infectious diseases and provides relevant definitions. This version of this proposed legislation addresses concerns surrounding occupations where masks are relevant such as painters or police officers. In response to committee questions, Rep. Gallagher clarified this would prevent a city employee from requiring a sick visitor to wear a

mask in city buildings.

MOTION: Rep. Young made a motion to introduce RS 31058 with the following changes;

On page 1 line 40 strike the word 'use' and replace with the word 'requirement', and on page 2 line 4 following the word 'materials' add the words 'or biohazards'.

Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 31099: Rep. Alfieri presented RS 31099 explaining it is a proposed resolution in support

of the right of Texas to secure its boarder under the provisions laid out in Article One Section Ten if the US Constitution. The proposed legislation asks the House to

join the Governor in support of Texas.

MOTION: Rep. Barbieri made a motion to introduce RS 31099. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 30852: Rep. Skaug presented RS 30852 explaining this proposed legislation amends the

'no public funds for abortion' law in Idaho by prohibiting organizations which provide abortions from publishing sex education curricula in schools. Currently, abortion promoting organizations are able to provide Idaho students with free materials in school. In response to committee questions, Rep. Skaug clarified this would still prohibit materials from these organizations from being distributed in schools even if

the materials themselves are not regarding abortion.

MOTION: Rep. Scott made a motion to introduce RS 30852. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 31060: Rep. Barbieri presented RS 31060 explaining this proposed legislation has been

brought to address concern that smaller communities will not be comfortable forming auditorium districts if they have the restriction of needing 3000 registered electors in order to dissolve it. This proposed legislation would lower that number to fifty percent of the total sum of the qualified electorate. In response to committee questions, Rep. Barbieri clarified more information about the size and make up of

auditorium districts will be brought to a full hearing.

MOTION:	Rep. Scott made a motion to introduce	RS 31060. Motion carried by voice vote.
