**CONVENED:** Chair VanOrden called the meeting of the Senate Health and Welfare Committee

(Committee) to order at 3:03 p.m.

INTRODUCTION: Page Introduction: Alexis Marshall. Chair VanOrden stated the Committee

had a new page Alexis Marshall and asked her to introduce herself. **Ms. Marshall** stated she was from Arimo, a small town 30 miles south of Pocatello. She planned

to go to Gillette College on a soccer scholarship after high school.

MINUTES Senator Harris moved to approve the Minutes of January 16, 2024. Senator

**APPROVAL:** Bjerke seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

MINUTES Senator Lee moved to approve the Minutes of January 17, 2024. Senator

**APPROVAL:** Wintrow seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

MINUTES Senator Taylor moved to approve the Minutes of January 22, 2024. Senator

**APPROVAL:** Zuiderveld seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

MINUTES Senator Harris moved to approve the Minutes of January 23, 2024. Senator

**APPROVAL:** Taylor seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

S 1354 HEALTH - Amends existing law to establish provisions for electroconvulsive

**treatment (ECT) for children**. Senator Lee stated the bill would change the age for ECT to 12. She relayed that people from Idaho were having to travel to Utah or other states for the procedure. Dr. Jacob White was a provider of this treatment

and explained what it entailed.

In response to Committee questions, **Dr. White** stated he was part of a group of 5 doctors. He explained that the procedure was used in addition to medication. Insurance carriers covered the procedure for patients 18 and older, but did not know if they would cover from age 12-18. **Dr. White** explained that one side effect

was a memory loss gap for the day of the treatment.

**TESTIMONY:** Gina White testified in support of the bill. She provided the details of her

daughter's struggles and the success of the ECT treatment. **David Lehman**, representing Cottonwood Creek, explained the section of the bill that dealt with informed consent of a voluntary admission and the involuntary treatment requiring a court order. **Dee Carter** testified in support of the bill. He relayed his personal

experiences and undergoing ECT multiple times.

MOTION: Senator Harris moved to send S 1354 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Taylor seconded the motion. The motion passed by

voice vote.

PASSED THE Chair VanOrden passed the gavel to Senator Lee. GAVEL: S 1355 MEDICAID - Adds to existing law to establish a medicaid legislative review panel. Senator VanOrden explained that during the interim there was a Medicaid committee. There were a number of contracts being administered in the State and the information was not getting back to the Legislature. The committee recommended a medicaid legislative review panel be put in place to review the contracts. DISCUSSION: In response to Committee questions, Chair VanOrden agreed that the panel would be looking at performance measures, which could include customer service, access, and quality of care. She relayed that the panel could check on the waivers and see what progress had been made or what are barriers there were. MOTION: Senator Harris moved to send S 1355 to the floor with a do pass recommendation. Senator Taylor seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote. ADJOURNED: There being no further business at this time, Chair VanOrden adjourned the meeting at 3:58 p.m.
