H 454 ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP - Amends existing law

to change the limit on the amount that may be distributed under the advanced opportunity scholarship for certain workforce training courses. Representative McCann stated that H 454 amended Idaho Code 33-4602, Subsection D. This legislation aimed to provide students with the opportunity to take career and technical courses by removing the \$500 limit per course. The

maximum allowable did not change.

MOTION: Senator Den Hartog moved to send H 454 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Toews seconded the motion. The motion carried by

voice vote.

H 580 MILITARY LEAVE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL AND PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL

EMPLOYEES - Adds to existing law to establish military leave for public school and public charter school employees. Representative Bundy explained H 580 would permit reservists and guardsmen working in public schools and charter

schools with a minimum of 10 days paid military leave.

MOTION: Senator Ward-Engelking moved to send H 580 to the floor with a do pass

recommendation. Senator Den Hartog seconded the motion. The motion carried

by voice vote.

H 529 EDUCATION - Amends existing law to require the superintendent of public

instruction to authorize funding from the Public Charter School Revolving Loan Fund upon the approval of the Idaho Housing and Finance Association. Senator Den Hartog said H 529 was a technical fix to allow the State Treasurer to

direct funds from the Public Charter School Revolving Loan Fund.

DISCUSSION: Chairman Lent restated that HB 529 was a technical fix in legislation passed last

year. **Senator Den Hartog** confirmed and explained the collaboration with the Idaho Housing and Finance Association in last year's legislation, and the recent

realization of the oversight.

MOTION: Senator Toews moved to send **H 529** to the floor with a do pass recommendation.

Senator Nichols seconded the motion. The motion carried by **voice vote**.
