Chair Yamamoto called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

**MOTION:** Rep. Sauter made a motion to approve the minutes of February 29, March 1, 4,

and 5, 2024. Motion carried by voice vote.

**S 1308: Sen. Den Hartog** presented **S 1308**, legislation regarding education and adoption.

She spoke about options for unplanned pregnancy, including adoption education.

MOTION: Rep. Mendive made a motion to send S 1308 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Ehardt will sponsor the bill

on the floor.

S 1359: Sen. Den Hartog presented S 1359, legislation regarding educational advanced

opportunities. She said this bill would increase funds for advanced opportunities and raise the cap on allotted number of courses and funds distributed per student, per year. She spoke about non-public student qualifications, usage, and

reimbursement.

MOTION: Rep. Ehardt made a motion to send S 1359 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Horman will sponsor

the bill on the floor.

S 1362aa: Rep. Price and Sen. Trakel presented S 1362aa, legislation regarding third party

flags in public schools. They said this bill would create a non-political environment

for children in the classroom.

Kristi Hardy testified in support of S 1359. She spoke about public classrooms

and division verses unity.

Those speaking **in opposition** to **S 1359** were **Mistie Tolman**, Planned Parenthood Alliance Advocates, **Liliana Rauer**, **Julia Sharkey**, Idaho Education Association, **Julianne Donnelly Tzul**, ACLU of Idaho, and **Nissa Nagel**. They spoke about

experiences, vulnerability, unification, acceptance, and student safety.

Committee members spoke about unification, language in the bill, certain teaching

aides, the National Motto, school policies and penalties.

MOTION: Rep. Hawkins made a motion to send S 1362aa to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation.

Committee members discussed political ideology, the "official" American flag, and focusing on education. They spoke about the First Amendment and local level

policy. They mentioned school and club flags.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION:	Rep. Mathias made a substitute motion to HOLD S 1362aa in committee.	
ROLL CALL VOTE ON SUBSTITUTE:	Roll call vote was requested. Substitute motion carried by a vote of 10 AYE, 5 NAY, and 1 Absent/Excused. Voting in favor of the motion: Reps. Yamamoto, McCann, Clow, Garner, Lanting, Nelsen, Sauter, Berch, Galaviz, and Mathias. Voting in opposition to the motion: Reps. Mendive, Ehardt, Hawkins, Hill, and Price. Rep. Wisniewski was absent/excused.	
S 1361aa: Rep. Nelsen and Sen. Carlson presented S 1361aa, legislation reschool district boards. They said this bill would adopt procedures for board meetings and allow public participation, regarding agenda ite		adopt procedures for regular school
	Pam Johnsen testified in support of S 1361aa. She spoke about public participation and parental rights.  Jim Foudy, Superintendent, Blaine County School District, testified in opposition to S 1361aa. He spoke about elected local board members, public comment policies, and board meeting transparency.  Quinn Perry, Idaho School Boards Association, testified as being neutral to S 1361aa. She spoke about local school boards, reasonable time limits, and agenda items. She said this bill would enhance policy and statute.	
	Committee members spoke about civil disobedience, exceptions, and language in the bill.	
MOTION:	<b>Rep. Ehardt</b> made a motion to send <b>S 1361aa</b> to the floor with a <b>DO PASS</b> recommendation. <b>Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Nelsen</b> will sponsor the bill on the floor.
