She spoke about investing in the children and implementing change. She said things improved when the focus shifted to the student. Currently Cascade is #1 for Science Proficiency in Idaho, a Top 10 District for Math Proficiency, a Top 20 District for English Proficiency, and 2022-23 #4 IHSAA School of Excellence. She said their mission is, "Engaging every student, every day, in character development and rigorous education." She asked the committee to simplify, clarify and remember the target.

In response to committee questions, **Superintendent Stevenson** spoke about the demographics of the school district, professional development, teacher turnover, and student attendance. She expressed the importance of educating all personnel on what's important, students and their achievement. She also spoke about the impact of the School Board having trust in District operations and personnel. She said data-based decisions work and when measured, things get done.

Chair Yamamoto put the committee at ease at 9:44 am.

Chair Yamamoto reconvened the meeting at 9:45 am.

Layne McInelly, President, Idaho Education Association, acknowledged the committee for changes and policies. He spoke about salary improvements and school facility issues which need to be addressed. He also spoke about safety for students, mental well-being, and providing more help for students.

Debbie Critchfield, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Office of the State Board of Education, spoke about the Board's experiences, communication and relationships with educators around the state. She said a missing component was leadership and how to use allotted money. She believes every student deserves one year of growth in one years time. She said curriculum choices are crucial and the Board is reviewing curriculums and rules and will provide results to school districts to help them be well-informed.

Superintendent Critchfield discussed 2024 goals, graduation requirements, and preparing Idaho kids for life as well as college and career. She spoke about growth and the need to modernize the educational funding structure and said the current formula was implemented in 1994. The Board would like to consolidate K-12 budgets and discontinue certain line items. A change would implement weighted, per student funding and reduce transportation funding complexity and address rising costs. She emphasized the importance of attracting and retaining exceptional teachers and leaders. Unfortunately 30% of educators leave after the first three years so she would like to see improvements to teacher prep programs. She also mention recruitment incentives for student teachers.

Chair Yamamoto turned the gavel over to Vice Chair McCann.

- **DOCKET NO.** Jenn Thompson, Chief Policy & Government Affairs, Office of the State Board of Education, presented **Docket No. 08-0203-2301**, regarding thoroughness. She said there is a simple reference which needs to be removed.
- MOTION: Rep. Yamamoto made a motion to approve Docket No. 08-0203-2301. Motion carried by voice vote.
- **DOCKET NO. Jenn Thompson,** Chief Policy & Government Affairs, Office of the State Board of Education, presented **Docket No. 08-0401-2301** regarding Idaho Digital Learning Academy, (IDLA). She spoke about the need to clean up definitions and to change the use of "on-line school" to "virtual."

In response to committee questions, **Jeff Simmons**, Superintendent, IDLA, spoke about final projects and said student projects are comprehensive. He said a final project may be better than scheduling a proctor to be with a student for a final test. He spoke about communication and the network available to provide help to students.

- H 422: Rep. Boyle presented H 422, proposed legislation regarding Public Charter Schools. Alex Adams, Administrator, Division of Financial Management, spoke about the need to update Charter School statute. He discussed the balance of accountability and earned autonomy, performance certificate reviews and providing support to Charter Schools. He said H 422 de-clutters language, fixes cross references, and he explained the application of the law concerning Charter Schools.

In response to committee questions, **Mr. Adams** spoke about the authorizers fund, rules and provisions, and the application process of education service providers.

Jacob Smith and **Alan Reed**, Charter School Commission and **Tom LeClaire**, Coalition of Idaho Charter School Families, spoke **in support** of **H 422**. They said this bill supports families, allows schools to be more efficient, and spoke about collaboration and education service providers.

Blake Youde and **Terry Ryan**, Idaho Charter School Network, and **Jon Wood** spoke about negotiations and collaboration. They spoke **in support** of **H 422** and said this bill provides efficiency and more resources for the growing population. **Janet Cox**, Idaho Home Learning Academy, also supports **H 422** and asked committee members to consider changing growth limits.

Monica White, Elevate Academy, and **Andy Johnson**, spoke **in support** of **H 422**, and emphasized accountability, high standards, and teacher certification. **Kelly Trudeau** also supports **H 422** and said the landscape has changed and this bill allows for updates.

Dr. Victoria Young and **Dr. Jean Henscheid** spoke **in opposition** of **H 422.** Dr. Young spoke about laws and rules which govern the replication of Charter Schools, commission structure and public input. Dr. Henscheid voiced concerns over state leadership not being involved.

Brandon Durst and Nicole Garnett, Professor, Notre Dame University, spoke in opposition of H 422, and said public funds should not be withheld from private schools.

Debbie Critchfield, Superintendent of Public Education, State Department of Education, and **Alex Adams** spoke about fostering and providing support in the creation and language of the bill.

MOTION: Vice Chair McCann made a motion to send H 422 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

Rep. Berch spoke **in opposition** of the motion, stating his concern over multiple charters under the Local Education Agency and raised questions about funding.

During discussion on the motion, committee members spoke **in support** of the motion. They spoke about collaboration, accountability, support for Charter Schools, and innovation. Committee members discussed the applicability of the Blaine Amendment. They said all involved parties had to make compromises in the writing of this legislation and said this would simplify the charter process.

In answer to committee questions, **Rep. Galaviz** said concern had been brought by a number of principals to update this statute, and there will be no interest when using credit / debit cards.

Rep. Lanting spoke **in support**, of the motion, noting how some educators must bring a blank check for activities such as field trips which is less secure than using a debit card associated with the account.

H 452: Rep. Petzke introduced **H 452** regarding Idaho Digital Learning Academy funding. The bill would fund enrollment at \$430, and these funds would not go toward what's irrelevant to IDLA. Also, JFAC could make changes to this dollar amount every year.

Jeff Simmons, Superintendent of IDLA spoke **in support** of the bill, and answered committee questions regarding definitions for enrollment and attendance for IDLA, how they differ from public schools, and how currently funding is based on enrollment.

Public testifier, **Brandon Durst**, spoke on his own behalf against the bill. He explained the statute was created during the recession session, and has issue with the \$430 amount. He worries that should there be another recession, the statute will need to change again.

In answer to a committee question regarding if students being enrolled in several classes affects funding, **Rep. Petzke** said yes, enrollment is per class.

MOTION: Rep. Garner made motion to send H 452 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Petzke will sponsor the bill on the floor.

- H 454: Rep. McCann introduced H 454 which gives flexibility with technical education courses through local institutions. Currently the law allows \$500 per course, or \$1,000 per year. This bill would allow \$1,000 per student per year and a rollover of unexpended funds up to \$1,000 per semester. Rep. McCann explained there could be a fiscal note per the Education Department of \$25,000 to \$75,000.
 Rep. McCann replied to a committee question saying since this has been in code for some period of time, and is not a part of the Launch Program.
- MOTION: Rep. Nelson made a motion to send H 454 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. McCann will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Clay Long, State Administrator from Idaho Division of Career Technical Education, reviewed the CTE's mission statement, did an overview of programs in high schools, technical schools, community colleges, and four-year universities in Idaho. He also reviewed successes from the past year, and program applications. Mr. Long discussed post graduate data, and the Skill Stack.

In answer to committee questions, **Clay Long** clarified what secondary program application means, saying it includes applications started, changed, and reinstated.

Tracie Bent, Chief Administrative Officer, CTE explained if a student receives certification or a degree but doesn't continue on to get an additional certification or a degree, they wouldn't be included in the go-on rate. Mr. Long said the bottlenecks for CTE is educator certification with too few staff members and wait lists of students, also, the funding for ongoing maintenance and support. CTE was supported during last year's legislature with the Career Ready Student Grant, which focuses on rural expansion. However, large districts have significant wait lists that causes challenges for students.

Mr. Long also stated the Inspire Ready Program starts with a week long boot camp, and can go up to three years for competency. As to problems obtaining staff for CTE at the College of Southern Idaho, Mr. Long said they are in discussions about the friction with variable pay and is proposing a pay scale to institutions and a comprehensive overhaul to address continued growth and faculty costs. CTE does have a wish list of areas in the state to have new career tech centers, and it is on their radar. Some school districts partner for joint facilities but it is not always easy for out of area students to travel there.

Clay Long introduced students **Madi Levitt**, Idaho FCCLA President, and **Luke Crosby**, Idaho TSA President to speak to the committee.

- **RS 31189: Rep. Clow** presented **RS 31189**, Idaho Opportunity Scholarships. This proposed legislation allows community colleges to be eligible for use of these scholarships with money that's already been appropriated annually. Last year community colleges were removed. It also prohibits use of an opportunity scholarship and a Launch grant to the same student in order to make scholarships available to more students. The proposed legislation also creates eligibility rules for renewing scholarship timing and provides guidance to the State Board of Education. The proposed legislation allocates 5% to adult learners who qualify.
- MOTION: Rep. Galaviz made a motion to introduce RS 31189. Motion carried by voice vote.
- **ADJOURN:** There being no further business to come before the committee, the meeting adjourned at 9:49 am.

Chair Yamamoto called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

H 451: Rep. Galaviz presented **H 451** which would allow multilingual students in grades K-3 an exemption from Idaho Reading Indicator for literacy - the state test for literacy. The indicator is mandatory for all Idaho public schools in fall and spring for K-3. The exemption would apply to students who have not been enrolled in U.S. schools for more than two years, and scored less than a two on the English Language Proficiency Assessment. If another language besides English is spoken in the home, a screener is prompted to indicate 6 levels of reading, talking, listening and writing. Each local school district has various language instruction programs to help students who receive the exemption. The data without this proposed legislation will not be accurate for educators.

In response to committee questions, **Rep. Galaviz** said there is potential for financial impact. 50% of funds are provided up front, the other half is distributed based on proficiency from the state test. Rep. Galaviz also explained there are state dollars available based on student population. Rep. Galaviz clarified that the strike-outs in the bill were to clean up two outdated assessments that are no longer conducted. As to whether parents are included in any of this, Rep. Galaviz said assessments are communicated to all parents at the local district level. Parents will also be notified if their children are exempt. She stated parents have the right to not allow their children to take the test. Rep. Galaviz responded that they will not need to sit for an exam that they don't understand, it will reduce their stress, as well as prevent false-negatives in reports for schools, and the child will then get the tailored instruction they need.

MOTION: Rep. Mathias made a motion to send H 451 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Galaviz will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Debbie Critchfield, Superintendent of Public Education for the State Department of Education introduced the Idaho Teacher of the Year, **Trent VanLeuven**, and explained the selection process to the committee.

Trent VanLeuven, agri-science instructor at Mackay High School, presented on how to develop talent pipelines and talent scouts, and their importance. He also discussed partnerships with Idaho colleges, and also discussed the dual credit program benefits. He mentioned the importance of professional volunteers working with students. In response to a committee question, **Trent VanLeuven** would be willing to present information about the Mackay High School fish lab to the committee.

- **RS 31016C1:** Sen. Den Hartog presented **RS 31016C1**, Charter School Revolving Loan Fund. This is a technical correction to last year's legislation - IHFA cannot directly draw down funds from the revolving loan fund, this allows the State Treasurer to direct the funds from the public charter school revolving loan fund to be withdrawn and distributed to the school after certification from IHFA. This will make sure the flow of the funds is appropriated and can be directed.

He stated a high percentage of students suffer from anxiety and depression and mentioned mental health rates and counseling for students. He reviewed thank you's written from students who received scholarships which had a positive impact on their families lives.

Dr. Nick Swayne, President, North Idaho College, spoke about student enrollment, graduation rates and student transfers. He explained the 2 + 2 program, which allows students to complete two years with NIC then complete two years with a University partner to obtain a degree. He spoke about cyber-security support, funding for health professions and vehicle operation training courses.

Mr. Gordon Jones, President, College of Western Idaho, said CWI is the largest community college in the state with 98% of enrollment being Idahoans. He spoke about providing life long learning opportunities, workforce preparation, and affordable education. He said CWI supports the Launch program for students and he also spoke about the need to increase faculty pay to meet the cost of inflation.

He said the cost and burden this legislation may require differs depending on current policy at schools and districts. Those speaking **in support of H 539**, were **Morgan Ballis**, School Resource Officer, and **Katie Russell**, Idaho School Boards Association. They said **H 539** would help bring equity to school safety practices, communication, and parent engagement concerning violence and self-harm prevention.

Committee members said parents and families are critical partners with schools and spoke about the need to address these issues.

Debbie Critchfield, Superintendent of Public Instruction, State Department of Education, spoke about K-12 budget requests submitted in September 2024. She explained where money comes from, how it is distributed, and modernizing school funding. She explained consolidating the K-12 budget into three budgets aligned with the state's constitutional obligations and supporting local flexibility. The three budgets include staffing and operations, student achievement and accountability, and weighted per student funding. She spoke about implementing weighted per student funding, providing outcomes-based funding and reducing transportation funding complexity and addressing rising costs.

Starr Olsen, Dietrich School District Trustee, spoke about Dietrich literacy goals and the changes implemented to accomplish these goals. He explained how proper training helps students improve in literacy.

Jason Sevy, Marsing School District Trustee, discussed school safety. He spoke about intervention, collaboration and ways to ensure school safety.

Leslie Baker, Moscow Charter School, said her school opened in 1998 and is the oldest charter school in Idaho. She spoke about technology updates, social development, wellness benefits, and communication with parents.

Teresa Rae, Boundary County School District, spoke about school facilities in small districts. She explained the poor conditions of older buildings, state funds and school bonds.

Eric Smallwood, Twin Falls School District, spoke about school facilities in large districts. He expressed the need to upgrade HVAC systems in several older buildings.

Karen Pyron, Butte County School District, spoke about advantages of a 4-day school week. She said Friday is available to provide extra instruction for struggling students or for teacher preparation.

Delainee Ellsworth, State President, Future Farmers of America (FFA), spoke about individual needs and personal growth. She said FFA gives students a purpose and provides service opportunities.

Carson Suchan, State Vice President, FFA, explained career and leadership events which prepare students for life after high school.

Hallye Duckett, State Secretary, FFA, spoke about leadership conferences, competitions, and advocating for Idaho agriculture.

Clayton Moore, State Treasurer, FFA, explained the impact and overall experience of FFA. He spoke about a three circle education model to provide a well rounded experience.

Josiah Knapp, State Reporter, FFA spoke about experience opportunities and how to share with peers.

Kamille Mirkin, State Sentinel, FFA, spoke about different career opportunities and leadership skills in the agriculture industry.

- **RS 31234: Rep. Palmer** presented **RS 31234**, proposed legislation regarding School Boards and libraries. He said many schools do not utilize the library and this legislation would allow a school district board to determine whether to equip and maintain a library in any school.

He spoke about ICOM partnerships with Idaho hospitals, health systems and the medical community. He spoke about student academic and professional performance and the need for more doctors in Idaho.

Jeff Murray, third year student, ICOM, said he is a graduate of the University of Idaho. **Annie Hoffman**, second year student, ICOM, said she is a graduate of Boise State University. They spoke about their experiences at ICOM.

Ryan Cantrell, Chief Deputy Superintendent, State Department of Education, spoke about a reading program instituted at West Jefferson School District. He introduced **Shane Williams**, Superintendent of West Jefferson School District. Superintendent Williams explained the science of reading in practice and spoke about research-based reading instruction, intervention, and literacy improvements. He said teachers have regular data meetings to see what adjustments need to be made. He spoke about small school districts and funding.

Kyle Johnson, Principal, spoke about believing in students, showing support and watching growth happen.

HJR 2: Rep. Furniss presented **HJR 2**, legislation regarding indebtedness limits. He spoke about elections and percentage requirements.

Teresa Rae and **Dale Layne** testified **in support** of **HJR 2**. They spoke about school bonds, poor conditions of school facilities, and encouraging voter participation.

Ron Nate, President, Idaho Freedom Foundation, testified **in opposition** of **HJR 2**, and said there is potential confusion over the language in the bill. He spoke about national and local debt and said this legislation would make it too easy to incur debt.

Russ Hendricks, Idaho Farm Bureau Federation, testified **in opposition** of **HJR 2**, and said it is important to retain the 2/3 voter support from the community. He spoke about taxes, bonds and additional levy's for farmers and ranchers. He believes there are better solutions to provide money for school facilities.

Quinn Perry, Idaho School Boards Association, and **Chris Parri,** Idaho Education Association, testified **in support** of **HJR 2**. They spoke about local community obligations to schools, how the bond threshold affects smaller areas, and the costs associated with building new schools. They mentioned fewer election dates and spoke about volunteers who prepare bond information.

Committee members expressed concern for families, and said there is already an inflation problem and increasing property taxes would add to the burden. They spoke about revenue bonds, funding from the State, and shifting the responsibility to businesses instead of home owners. They spoke about restricting rights verses expanding rights and said this legislation would allow the community to decide on tax increases during elections. Committee members spoke about an obligation to the children attending schools in need of repair and said student safety is most important.

- MOTION: Rep. Berch made a motion to send HJR 2 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Reps. Ehardt, Mendive, Wisniewski, Price and Hawkins requested to be recorded as voting NAY. Rep. Furniss will sponsor the bill on the floor.

- **H 634: Rep. Horman** presented **H 634**, legislation regarding broadband. She said this would transfer broadband program funds from the State Department of Education to the State Board of Education.
- MOTION: Rep. Galaviz made a motion to send H 634 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Horman will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Dr. Cynthia Pemberton, President, Lewis-Clark State College (LCSC), spoke about the small college experience and returns on investment. She said LCSC offers affordable education, open education resources, workforce training, and a GED program. She spoke about nursing, radio graphic, social work and teacher education programs. She spoke about being a partner with Idaho State University with medical industry education.

Scott Green, President, University of Idaho (U of I), spoke about the value of University research to the state of Idaho, an increase in enrollment, and meeting needs of Idaho. He spoke about financial turnaround, scholarship funding, and returns on student investment. He gave an explanation of the agriculture program, new associate degrees, enrollment increase in cyber security, and spoke of the need for more medical professionals. He said U of I has the highest Reserve Officers' Training Corp. (ROTC) enrollment in the state and touched on military history and training.

Jeff Seegmiller, Regional Dean and Director, U of I, spoke about the University of Washington School of Medicine, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana and Idaho (WWAMI) program and the direct impact of enrollment and retention rates in medical schools due to new laws passed.

Dr. Robert Wagner, President, Idaho State University, spoke about enrollment and tools which foster transformation and growth. He described the significant progress made in student retention and the commitment to provide affordable and relevant education. He said ISU is the only public University to offer a tuition lock program. He spoke about the health care and engineering programs and said it is important to keep facilities and resources up to date to maintain proper instruction.

Dr. Marlene Tromp, President, Boise State University (BSU), spoke about enrollment growth, graduation rates, and financial efficiency. She explained research experiences, philanthropy, and programs for in-demand occupations. She spoke about the increase in ROTC enrollment and their full service veterans center. In response to committee comments, she spoke about semiconductor and data driven programs which help students succeed and she described the character and creativity of the athletics program.

In response to committee comments, each president spoke about CEC administrative funding and the impact Idaho Launch will provide students.

Rep. Clow introduce **Dr. Mark Crandall,** Dolly Parton Imagination Library and the United Way, who spoke about the history of this early literacy program and ways to help it grow in Idaho.

ADJOURN: There being no further business to come before the committee, the meeting adjourned at 10:48 am.

Rep. Raybould said **H 636** would create an Office of Early Childhood to oversee the state's early childhood services. She spoke about accountability, transparency, and flexibility. She said this would remove the barrier of two departments and help identify ways to do the job better.

Dr. Jean Henscheid, League of Women Voters of Idaho, testified **in support of H 636** and said this would allow state and private agencies to align, lower mediation costs, and support parents and families.

Ron Nate, Idaho Freedom Foundation, spoke **in opposition to H 636.** He said this legislation mingles state funds with private funds. He spoke about federal code and dependence on the federal government.

Emily Allen, Idaho Voices for Children, testified **in support of H 636**, and said early childhood is complex. She said there is no need to create new programs as infant and toddler programs would transfer from the Department of Health and Welfare.

Committee members spoke about early childhood education and the Idaho Constitution. Other committee members spoke about the responsibility to children.

MOTION: Rep. McCann made a motion to introduce RS 31538.

SUBSTITUTERep. Clow made a substitute motion to HOLD H 636 in committee. MotionMOTION:carried by voice vote.

- **MOTION: Rep. McCann** made a motion to introduce **RS 31538** and recommend it be sent directly to the second reading calendar.
- ROLL CALL VOTE: Roll call vote was requested. Motion carried by a vote of 8 AYE, 6 NAY, and 2 Absent/Excused. Voting in favor of the motion: Reps. Committee members discussed data driven instruction, extra support for non-english speaking students, future funding, and matrix monitoring.

MOTION: Rep. Clow made a motion to send **H 595** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation.

Committee members voiced concern about discretionary funds distribution.

- VOTE ON Chair Yamamoto called for a vote on the motion to send H 595 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Petzke will sponsor the bill on the floor.
- **S 1274: Rep. Petzke** presented **S 1274**, legislation regarding diversity statement prohibition. He spoke about diversity, equity, inclusion (DEI), and state policy regarding hiring and admission decisions.

- **S 1362aa: Rep. Price** and **Sen. Trakel** presented **S 1362aa**, legislation regarding third party flags in public schools. They said this bill would create a non-political environment for children in the classroom.

Kristi Hardy testified in support of S 1359. She spoke about public classrooms and division verses unity.

Those speaking **in opposition** to **S 1359** were **Mistie Tolman**, Planned Parenthood Alliance Advocates, Liliana Rauer, Julia Sharkey, Idaho Education Association, Julianne Donnelly Tzul, ACLU of Idaho, and Nissa Nagel. They spoke about experiences, vulnerability, unification, acceptance, and student safety.

Committee members spoke about unification, language in the bill, certain teaching aides, the National Motto, school policies and penalties.

MOTION: Rep. Hawkins made a motion to send S 1362aa to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

Committee members discussed political ideology, the "official" American flag, and focusing on education. They spoke about the First Amendment and local level policy. They mentioned school and club flags.

SUBSTITUTE Rep. Mathias made a substitute motion to HOLD S 1362aa in committee. MOTION:

S 1361aa: Rep. Nelsen and **Sen. Carlson** presented **S 1361aa**, legislation regarding public school district boards. They said this bill would adopt procedures for regular school board meetings and allow public participation, regarding agenda items.

Pam Johnsen testified **in support** of **S 1361aa**. She spoke about public participation and parental rights.

Jim Foudy, Superintendent, Blaine County School District, testified **in opposition** to **S 1361aa.** He spoke about elected local board members, public comment policies, and board meeting transparency.

Quinn Perry, Idaho School Boards Association, testified as being **neutral** to **S 1361aa.** She spoke about local school boards, reasonable time limits, and agenda items. She said this bill would enhance policy and statute.

Committee members spoke about civil disobedience, exceptions, and language in the bill.

RS 31762: Reps. Yamamoto and **Clow** presented **RS 31762**, proposed legislation regarding school facilities. This is a trailer bill to **H 521** this session that makes several changes: 1) It ensures the executive officer of the state board is Senate confirmed; 2) It lightens the minimum days requirement for schools by eliminating the requirement for contract days, delays implementation to 2025 to ensure legislative oversight of board decisions, and provides the state board flexibility to phase in hours or days requirements; 3) It ensures any misused dollars by a local school district are recaptured to the schools facilities fund and distributed to rural schools; 4) It amends to one-time distributions from the school district facilities fund; 5) It restores public charter school facility funds to what they were prior to unanticipated reductions from funding formulas impacted by the passage of **H 292** in 2023; and 6) It resolves a conflict within Section 33-5209A, Idaho Code.

Committee members spoke about transparency, properly vetted legislation, and the process to appoint the executive officer. In response to questions, **Alex Adams**, Administrator, Division of Financial Management, spoke about a 2 year hold harmless adjustment for the 2025 and 2026 calendar years.

- MOTION: Rep. Garner made a motion to introduce RS 31762 and recommend it be sent directly to the Second Reading Calendar. Motion carried by voice vote. Reps. Yamamoto and Clow will sponsor the bill on the floor.
