HOUSE BILL NO. 24 BY AGRICULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LABELING OF ALTERNATIVE ANIMAL PROTEIN PRODUCTS; AMENDING TITLE 37, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 16, TITLE 37, IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO PROVIDE FOR LABELING REQUIREMENTS FOR ALTERNATIVE ANIMAL PROTEINS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
