SUBMITTED IF REQUIRED BY THE DIVISION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSES; AMENDING SECTION 54-3405C, IDAHO CODE, TO **PROVIDE** THAT FINGERPRINT-BASED CRIMINAL BACKGROUND HISTORY CHECKS SHALL BE SUBMITTED IF REQUIRED BY THE DIVISION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSES: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
