SENATE BILL NO. 1038

AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH; AMENDING TITLE 39, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 73, TITLE 39, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE OF IDAHO SHALL NOT BE COMPELLED TO ENGAGE IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF REQUIREMENTS OR MANDATES ISSUED BY THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 39, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chapter 73, Title 39, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

CHAPTER 73
MISCELLANEOUS HEALTH PROVISIONS

39-7301. WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION MANDATES. (1) The state of Idaho and its political subdivisions, including but not limited to counties, cities, towns, precincts, water districts, school districts, school administrative units, or quasi-public entities, shall not be compelled to engage in the enforcement of, or any collaboration with the enforcement of, any requirements or mandates issued by the world health organization.

(2) Any requirements or mandates issued by the world health organization shall not be used in the state as a basis for action or to direct, order, or otherwise impose, contrary to the constitution and laws of this state, any requirements whatsoever, including those for masks, vaccines, or medical testing, or to gather any public or private information about the state's citizens or residents and shall have no force or effect in this state.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2025.
