5	EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 48, Title 33, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 33-4806, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 33-4806. PARENT TECH AWARENESS PROGRAM. (1) The state department of education shall establish and make available to all Idaho public schools and private schools serving students in kindergarten through grade 12 an online parent tech awareness program. Each school district board of trustees and public charter school board of directors shall offer, without charge, the online parent tech awareness program established pursuant to this section to the parents and legal guardians of students in the school district or public charter school.
- (2) The state department of education may develop the online parent tech awareness program or may contract with a third-party entity for such development.
- (3) The online parent tech awareness program shall enhance parent and legal quardian awareness of:
 - (a) The potential dangers inherent in the use of devices with internet capabilities, including but not limited to cellular phones and computers;
 - (b) The nature of online threats;
 - (c) The mechanisms required to, and the ways in which children, participate and engage in online activity that is a threat or risk to their safety; and
 - (d) Best practices and strategies for parents and legal guardians to protect students from threats and exploitation on the internet and on social media.
- (4) At the beginning of each school year, or at the enrollment period for new students, each school district and public charter school shall provide parents and legal guardians of students in the school district or public charter school with information regarding the online parent tech awareness program, including information on how to access the program. Each school district and public charter school shall also require the parents and legal guardians of the students to sign a form developed by the state department of education acknowledging receipt of the information provided in this subsection.

(5) The form provided for in subsection (4) of this section shall be signed by the parent or legal guardian of the student and returned to the school district or public charter school.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2025.
