- **RS 31797: Rep. Pohanka** presented **RS 31797** regarding fingerprinting services for private entities serving vulnerable populations.

Committee inquired regarding origin of legislation.

Jeff Nye, Deputy Attorney General, Idaho Office of the Attorney General, testified **in neutrality.**

Committee inquired regarding the definition of "official capacity", clarification of jurisdictional conflicts and conflicts of interest, open-meeting law violations, and the number of annual proceedings.

Jeff Nye defined "official capacity" as interactions using official resources or in official locations, discussed the lack of jurisdictional conflicts and conflicts of interest with legislation, clarified the jurisdiction over State open-meeting law violations, related there are approximately twelve to fifteen complaints investigated annually, affirmed no additional resources needed to carry out prosecution of elected city officials, and related how an open-meeting law exception was no longer needed.

Mark Taylor testified in support of H 6.
