**HOUSE STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE**

**GUESTS:** The sign-in sheet will be retained in the committee secretary's office; following the end of session the sign-in sheet will be filed with the minutes in the Legislative Library.

**Chairman Crane (13)** called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Dygert** made a motion to approve the minutes of February 14, 2025. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

**RS 32353:** **Rep. Cornilles** presented **RS 32353** which amends Idaho Code 18-4116 and clarifies the definitions of willful and lewd indecent exposure.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Pohnonka** made a motion to introduce **RS 32353**.

A committee member commented this proposed legislation targets the following groups: transgender Idahoans, breast surgery recipients, plastic surgeon's council, and those with indecent car parts while driving.

**VOTE ON MOTION:** **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Achilles** and **Rep. Green** requested to be recorded as voting **NAY**.

**RS 32354:** **Rep. Boyle** presented **RS 32354** which prohibits advertising in Idaho of illegal product and services.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Skaug** made a motion to introduce **RS 32354**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

**RS 32273:** **Rep. Hill** presented **RS 32273** which will enhance the current language to add the prohibition of financial institutions and not just payment networks that facilitate credit card processing assigning unique credit card codes to firearms retailers that sell weapons and ammunition in Idaho. The tracking of these codes will allow unprecedented surveillance of 2nd Amendment activity by the sharing with the government.

A committee member asked a question around using debit cards along with credit cards.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Barbieri** made a motion to introduce **RS 32273**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

**RS 32342:** **Rep. Hill** presented **RS 32342**. This proposed legislation provides an alternative to the hiring of armed guards by giving the opportunity for Public K-12 school employees to carry concealed weapons and can act as an armed protection force within the confines of school property. Additionally, this proposed legislation requires all schools to remove "Gun Free Zone" signs from all public K-12 schools.

Committee members had questions around the fiscal note and the cost responsibility of teachers and schools to pay POST, clarification of the cost to attend POST, and hollow point ammunition.

**MOTION:** Rep. Alfieri made a motion to introduce **RS 32342**.

Committee members had additional questions around training from POST independent contractors, how many times one must qualify on the range, deputy's level of training, teacher liability, and a school boards right to refuse the right to carry. Committee members had comments around the consistency of knowing who is carrying a weapon and the neutral support of the local police.

**VOTE ON MOTION:** Motion carried by voice vote.

**H 223:** Rep. Barbieri presented **H 223** which is amending the code regarding Legislative Review of Administrative Rules to require concurrent resolution when rejecting an existing (final) rule, setting the termination time of June 30th of the year the rule is rejected. Additionally, allows the expiration of temporary, or fee and non-fee rules to be stated in the concurrent resolution as an alternative to sine die.

Committee members asked questions around the Stiker Rule and the three types of rules being Temporary Rules, Pending Rules, and the Final Rules.

**MOTION:** Rep. Scott made a motion to send **H 223** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion is carried by voice vote.** Rep. Barbieri will sponsor the bill on the floor.

**Motion is carried by voice vote.**

**ADJOURN:** There being no further business to come before the committee, the meeting adjourned at 9:31 AM.
