about patriotism, unity, strength, and commitment to the future. He said this legislation would allow for any country and any state flag or banner to be displayed in the classroom. He addressed student comfort and the need to bring patriotism

back into the classroom.

In response to committee questions, **Rep. Hill** spoke about school property, on-line classrooms, and enforcement policy. He specified flags or banners which affiliate with a political party, race, sexual orientation, gender, or a political ideology should

not be displayed on school property.

Greg Wilson, Chief of Staff, State Department of Education, spoke about current

policy, recognition, and local level decisions.

Cassie Horner, Mary Ruckh, and Liliana Rauer testified in opposition to H 10. They spoke about inclusion, diversity, human rights, and providing a safe harbor for students. They mentioned political belief, free expression, and human

characteristics. Areas within school property were also mentioned.

Edward Clark, Idaho Family Policy Center, and **Daniel Murphy**, testified **in support** of **H 10.** They expressed responsibility as citizens to nurture young minds with truths and symbols. They spoke about how the American flag is a symbol which should bring us together as a nation. They touched on division and inclusion

in schools.

Rep. Hill closed by speaking about the American flag and inclusion.

Committee members spoke about current policies, regulations, and distractions.

MOTION: Rep. Marmon made a motion to send H 10 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Rep. Wisniewski made a substitute motion to send H 10 to General Orders. .

During discussion on the motions, committee members spoke about local control, current policy and law, and clarification of terms. They addressed distractions, inclusion and education in the classroom. They mentioned the Idaho Constitution, laws without penalty, legislative bills and resolutions. The expressed concern for possible problems if some country flags or banners were allowed to be displayed in the classroom.

Rep. Marmon called for the previous question and requested a roll call vote. **Chairman Pickett** ruled the call out of order.

ROLL CALL VOTE ON SUBSTITUTE MOTION: Roll call vote was requested. Substitute motion failed by a vote of 5 AYE and 9 NAY. Voting in favor of the substitute motion: Reps. He said under current law, parents can remove their students from school and transfer prior to being punished for dangerous conduct thus avoiding a record of expulsion or discipline for the incident. He said this proposed legislation would add language to allow school districts to preserve their current authority to deny enrollment also in cases where a student is "disenrolled in lieu of discipline..."

MOTION: Rep. Nelsen made a motion to introduce RS 32016.

Committee members shared concerns over language in RS 32016 and Chairman

Pickett put the meeting at ease for 2 minutes.

community bond capacity, the application process, and fund distribution.

Dr. Cynthia Pemberton, President, Lewis-Clark State College, spoke about College institutions in Idaho and introduced University Presidents. She said Lewis-Clark is a small, private school experience at an affordable school price. She mentioned a prison education program, CTE, Idaho Launch, and apprenticeship

programs.

Dr. Marlene Tromp, President, Boise State University, spoke about enrollment, administrative costs, graduation, and economic impact. She said BSU is an institute for advancing American values and touched on civil discourse, free speech, and Idaho voices. In response to committee members questions, Dr. Tromp explained details of a lawsuit against BSU and addressed Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) certification.

C. Scott Green, President, University of Idaho, spoke about practical, quality education, Idaho Launch, extension programs, and research enterprise. He touched on enrollment growth, alumni, and associate degrees. In response to committee questions he commented on animal pollution, and federal grants.

In response to committee questions, **Dr. Pemberton**, clarified the Complete College America framework considers fifteen course credits per semester, full time. She addressed work force training and Launch programs.

Dr. Robert Wagner, President, Idaho State University, said ISU is the Health Science leader for Idaho and touched on enrollment growth, workforce outcomes, and Idaho Launch, He pointed out affordable certifications and degrees, dual enrollment, rural mental health, administrative efficiency, and the importance of partner institutions. Committee members asked him to address mental health, graduation, and employment in Idaho.

Rep. Hill explained the purpose of structure, good leadership, and leverage of all resources. He said too many board members creates too many problems. In response to committee member comments, he mentioned the School Safety and

Advisory Board gives recommendations to school boards.

Committee members shared concern about proposed number of board members
