HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 14 BY RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE A JOINT MEMORIAL

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, TO THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION, TO THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION REPRESENTING THE STATE OF IDAHO IN THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES.

We, your Memorialists, the House of Representatives and the Senate of the State of Idaho assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, do hereby respectfully represent that:

WHEREAS, water is the foundation of Idaho's farms, communities, and economy, yet the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer continues to decline, forcing water curtailments that now threaten farmers and ground water users every year; and

WHEREAS, Idaho faces longer, hotter summers and warmer winters that reduce snowpack and cause runoff to occur earlier in the year, leaving less water available when it is needed most; and

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho irrigates more acres than ever before, but shrinking and inconsistent snowpack has created shortages that harm farms, cities, fish, and industry; and

WHEREAS, Idaho loses between 1.5 and 2 million acre-feet of water each year as it flows down the Snake River and out to the ocean simply because the state lacks sufficient reservoir space to capture it; and

WHEREAS, while aquifer recharge has proven to be an effective tool, it cannot be sustained without additional late-season water derived from storage; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Legislature has demonstrated its commitment to water infrastructure through significant annual appropriations, and the people of Idaho have demonstrated broad public support for the research and construction of new reservoirs and expanded storage capacity; and

WHEREAS, to secure the future of our farms, communities, and economy, Idaho must commit to a long-term vision to build 750,000 acre-feet of new water storage by the year 2100; and

WHEREAS, practical near-term solutions have been identified, including modest raises at Minidoka Dam, Jackson Lake, and American Falls Dam; and

WHEREAS, mid-range and long-term opportunities exist for new reservoirs at locations such as Lane Lake, Chester, Soda Springs, Upper Badger Creek, Spring Creek, Moody Creek, and other potential sites, which would offer hydropower, extended irrigation seasons, flood protection, and recreation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislature respectfully urges the United States Congress, the Department of the Interior, and the Bureau of Reclamation to cooperate with the State of Idaho to:

(1) Move forward immediately with fast-track research on the feasibility and desirability of small reservoir raises at Minidoka Dam, Jackson Lake, and American Falls Dam;

(2) Support planning and design work for new medium-sized reservoirs across eastern Idaho;

(3) Facilitate creative financing options through federal funds and public-private partnerships; and

(4) Assist in the completion of an updated basin study in the next two to three years to identify priority projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State of Idaho commits to the goal of "750k by 2100" by creating 750,000 acre-feet of new water storage by the year 2100 to turn today's water shortage into tomorrow's water security.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Memorial to the President of the United States, to the Secretary of the Interior, to the Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of Congress, and to the congressional delegation representing the State of Idaho in the Congress of the United States.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 23
BY JUDICIARY, RULES AND ADMINISTRATION
COMMITTEE**

A HOUSE RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF RULE 18 OF THE RULES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives deems it necessary and desirable that Rule 18 of the Rules of the House of Representatives be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the House of Representatives, assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, that Rule 18 of the Rules of the House of Representatives shall be amended to read as follows:

RULE 18

Call of the House. – One-third of the members present may order a call of the House in the following manner:

A call being moved and seconded, the Speaker shall require those desiring a call to rise, and if one-third of the members present shall rise, there shall be a call of the House. A call of the House being ordered, the Sergeant at Arms shall close and lock the doors to the east wing of the third floor of the state capitol building and no member shall be allowed to leave the Chamber. The Speaker shall immediately cause the roll of the members to be taken and note the absentees whose names shall be read and entered upon the Journal in such manner as to show who are absent with leave and who are absent without leave, and the Sergeant at Arms shall proceed to bring in such absentees; but arrest of members of absence shall not be made unless ordered by a majority of members present.

While the House is under call, no business shall be transacted except to receive and act on the report of the Sergeant at Arms, and no other motion shall be in order except a motion to suspend further proceedings under the call or to excuse absentees, which motion shall be determined by ayes and nays; and the motion to suspend further proceedings under the call or to excuse members shall not be adopted unless a majority of the entire membership vote in favor thereof. While the House is under call, all members shall return to their floor desks whenever business shall be transacted.

When the Sergeant at Arms will make a report showing that all who were absent without leave are present, the call of the House may be dispensed with or the House may proceed under the call on a majority vote of the entire membership, with its regular business.

No motion for call of the House shall be entered after the House has commenced voting by ayes and nays.

**HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 28
BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE**

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND ENCOURAGING THE PEOPLE OF IDAHO TO OBSERVE A DAY OF FASTING AND PRAYER ON MARCH 1, 2026, TO SEEK PEACEFUL RESOLUTIONS TO THE CHALLENGES FACING THE STATE AND NATION, TO PRAY FOR SNOW AND RAIN FOR IDAHO'S WATER SUPPLIES, AND TO PRAY FOR WISE DECISION-MAKING BY STATE AND FEDERAL LEADERS.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, in these perilous times, our nation and the world are beset by escalating political violence, including grievous attacks and dire threats that rend the fabric of societal stability and peace; and

WHEREAS, widespread protests across the United States, even in Idaho's own cities such as Boise and Pocatello, bespeak profound discontent over matters of governance, immigration enforcement, public lands, veteran benefits, and perils to social security; and

WHEREAS, acts of violence at gatherings, economic uncertainties, fears attending immigration actions, and rising tides of antisemitism and division sow seeds of unrest in Idaho and throughout the land; and

WHEREAS, water is the very lifeblood of Idaho, sustained by bountiful snows and rains to our mountains, yet the winter of 2026 hath brought scant moisture, leaving our lands parched and our waters diminished; and

WHEREAS, throughout the annals of American history, in seasons of great affliction and national calamity, the federal government hath solemnly called upon its citizens to observe days of fasting, humiliation, and prayer, as when the Continental Congress issued at least fifteen proclamations for fasting, prayer, and thanksgiving between 1775 and 1784; and

WHEREAS, President George Washington, in humble acknowledgment of Almighty God, proclaimed November 26, 1789, as a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to render thanks unto Divine Providence for His manifold mercies; and

WHEREAS, President John Adams, amid gathering storms of war, designated May 9, 1798, as a day of solemn humiliation,

fasting, and prayer, beseeching the Ruler of Nations to avert impending conflict; and

WHEREAS, President James Madison, during the trials of the War of 1812, set apart July 9, 1812, as a day of public humiliation and prayer, entreating divine aid for the republic's deliverance; and

WHEREAS, President James Buchanan, facing the shadows of national dissolution, called for a day of humiliation, fasting, and prayer on December 14, 1860, imploring God's mercy upon a divided people; and

WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln, in the midst of the Civil War's bitter strife, appointed April 30, 1863, as a day of national humiliation, fasting, and prayer, urging the nation to confess its sins and seek reconciliation under Providence; and

WHEREAS, in more recent eras, the National Day of Prayer, ordained by Congress in 1952 and observed annually on the first Thursday in May, perpetuates this sacred tradition of seeking divine guidance in times of need; and

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho hath long honored such observances, as when Governor Brad Little joined Idahoans in recognizing the National Day of Prayer in 2021, and the Idaho Legislature hath supported daily times of prayer during its sessions; and

WHEREAS, kindred states in recent years have issued like calls, as Tennessee proclaimed July 2024 a month of prayer and fasting for God's mercy; Utah Governor Spencer Cox declared September 1, 2024, a day for national contemplation and June 29, 2025, a day of prayer and fasting for rain amid drought; and Texas Governor Greg Abbott set July 6, 2025, as a day of prayer for flood victims, urging citizens to seek solace and strength in faith; and

WHEREAS, these proclamations oft invoke humility, repentance, unity, and earnest supplication for divine intervention in afflictions such as natural disasters, societal discord, and moral decay.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislature humbly encourages the people of Idaho to observe March 1, 2026, as a day of fasting and prayer, voluntarily uniting in a spirit of profound humility and repentance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on this solemn day, Idahoans are earnestly urged to fast and, in humble supplication, beseech Divine Providence for peaceful resolutions to the afflictions besetting our state and nation, including violence, protests, and societal discord, imploring guidance toward unity and reconciliation among all peoples.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on this day, Idahoans are exhorted to fast and pray unto Almighty God for abundant moisture to replenish our state's vital water supplies, that our mountains may be crowned with snow and our rivers flow with life-giving waters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that fervent prayers be offered unto Divine Providence for our state and federal leaders, that they may be endowed with wisdom to render decisions guided by justice, compassion, and unity, and for God's gracious blessings and protection upon Idaho's communities and families and this great nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives be, and is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Congress of the United States, to the Governor of Idaho, and to all appropriate faith leaders and faith organizations throughout the state.
