A HOUSE RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND PROVIDING THAT ALL PENDING AND TEMPORARY RULES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND THE DIVISION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSES HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENT, ENERGY, AND TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE, WITH EXCEPTIONS.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, standing committees of the Legislature shall review any pending or temporary rule that is germane to its committee and has been published in the Idaho Administrative Bulletin; and

WHEREAS, the House Environment, Energy, and Technology Committee reviewed pending and temporary rules adopted by the Department of Environmental Quality and the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the House of Representatives, assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, that all pending and temporary rules adopted by the Department of Environmental Quality and the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act and submitted through the Office of the Administrative Rules Coordinator to the Legislature for review during the 2026 legislative session have been reviewed and approved by the House Environment, Energy, and Technology Committee, except for the following, which were not approved:

- (2) IDAPA 58.01.11, Department of Environmental Quality, Ground Water Quality Rules, Docket No. 58-0111-2501, Section 003. and Section 200., Subsection 01.a., only.
