**HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 37**  
**BY CAYLER**

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION  
STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND  
ENCOURAGING THE STATE TO REJECT AND RETURN  
ANY FUNDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE RURAL HEALTH  
TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, in February 2026, the Senate Health and Welfare Committee passed Senate Bill No. 1264, and in March 2026, the House Health and Welfare Committee passed House Bill No. 862. Both of these bills employ similar language to set up the Idaho Rural Health Transformation Fund in the state treasury. The language in these bills creates a new Chapter 25 in Title 56, Idaho Code, and Section 56-2501 of the proposed new chapter states in part, "The fund shall consist of moneys received by the state of Idaho from the federal rural health transformation program grant and such other moneys that may be provided by legislative appropriation."; and

WHEREAS, Idaho is to receive approximately \$1 billion from the federal government for the Rural Health Transformation Fund. And as stated when Idaho accepted American Rescue Plan Act funds in 2021, this money is borrowed from our grandchildren. These borrowed funds for rural health were secured to gain key congressional votes to secure the passage of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act; and

WHEREAS, the United States already spends over \$15,000 per person on health care or 18% of gross domestic product, more than any other high income nation. Throwing more federal money into the system will not improve rural health, but rather just further increase health care inflation; and

WHEREAS, these funds must be used within the parameters of the federally approved Idaho plan limiting state flexibility; and

WHEREAS, Idaho does not have to accept these funds just because they were awarded to the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislature strongly encourages the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee not to appropriate any funds associated with the Rural Health Transformation Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature strongly encourages the State Treasurer to return any and all funds associated with the Rural Health Transformation Program to the United States Treasury, whose debt is nearly \$39 trillion.

**BY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

A HOUSE RESOLUTION  
STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF  
REPRESENTATIVES AND PROVIDING FOR THE  
AMENDMENT OF RULE 18 OF THE RULES OF THE  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives deems it necessary and desirable that Rule 18 of the Rules of the House of Representatives be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the House of Representatives, assembled in the Second Regular

Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, that Rule 18 of the Rules of the House of Representatives shall be amended to read as follows:

RULE 18

Call of the House. – One-third of the members present may order a call of the House in the following manner:

A call being moved and seconded, the Speaker shall require those desiring a call to rise, and if one-third of the members present shall rise, there shall be a call of the House. A call of the House being ordered, the Sergeant at Arms shall close and lock the doors entrances to the east wing of the third floor of the state capitol building and no member shall be allowed to leave the Chamber. The Speaker shall immediately cause the roll of the members to be taken and note the absentees whose names shall be read and entered upon the Journal in such manner as to show who are absent with leave and who are absent without leave, and the Sergeant at Arms shall proceed to bring in such absentees; but arrest of members of absence shall not be made unless ordered by a majority of members present.

While the House is under call, no business shall be transacted except to receive and act on the report of the Sergeant at Arms, and no other motion shall be in order except a motion to suspend further proceedings under the call or to excuse absentees, which motion shall be determined by ayes and nays; and the motion to suspend further proceedings under the call or to excuse members shall not be adopted unless a majority of the entire membership vote in favor thereof. While the House is under call, all members shall remain at their floor desks unless the presiding officer puts the House at ease.

When the Sergeant at Arms will make a report showing that all who were absent without leave are present, the call of the House may be dispensed with or the House may proceed under the call on a majority vote of the entire membership, with its regular business.

No motion for call of the House shall be entered after the House has commenced voting by ayes and nays.
