BY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

A HOUSE RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND PROVIDING THAT ALL TEMPORARY AND PENDING RULES OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF LANDS, THE DIVISION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSES, THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION, AND THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE HOUSE RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE, WITH EXCEPTIONS.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, standing committees of the Legislature shall review any temporary or pending rule that is germane to its committee and has been published in the Idaho Administrative Bulletin; and

WHEREAS, the House Resources and Conservation Committee reviewed temporary and pending rules adopted by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the Idaho Department of Lands, the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses, the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation, and the Idaho Department of Water Resources.
