**HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 9
BY RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE
A JOINT MEMORIAL**

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

THE UNITED STATES IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATIONS REPRESENTING THE STATES OF IDAHO, UTAH, NEVADA, AND WYOMING IN THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY GENERAL, AND THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR.

We, your Memorialists, the House of Representatives and the Senate of the State of Idaho assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, do hereby respectfully represent that:

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) administers 245 million acres of public lands, which equates to roughly one tenth of all land in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Idaho, like most other western states, has large portions of land managed by BLM within its borders; and

WHEREAS, BLM land, and other federally owned land, is often intermingled with state and private lands, so exchanges and other disposal options are vital tools for administering such lands and achieving important recreation, community development, wildlife conservation, and resource development objectives, such as timber harvesting, mining, and energy projects; and

WHEREAS, given BLM's large ownership interest of lands within the United States, particularly within Idaho, and the intermingled nature of these lands, it is critical to Idaho, as it should be to the nation, that these lands are predictably managed in accordance with laws that were adopted to ensure orderly and consistent administration of such lands; and

WHEREAS, the federal government once managed these public lands under a patchwork of some 3,000 public land laws; and

WHEREAS, in 1964, Congress charged a commission to bring order to the process and propose ways to rationalize and systematize the management of public lands; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Congress acted on these recommendations by enacting the Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA). FLPMA is the comprehensive system for predictably managing public lands for multiple uses. The statute broadly applies to any land and interest in land owned by the United States, without regard to how the United States acquired ownership, that is administered by the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, wherein BLM resides; and

WHEREAS, FLPMA provided the tools vital to administering intermingled lands by establishing uniform procedures for the disposal of federally owned public land, including the authority and procedures to exchange public lands for non-federal lands, when it is in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, for the past 50 years, FLPMA's broad authority for conducting land exchanges has been universally recognized and acknowledged; however, a legal decision originating in Idaho threatens FLPMA's comprehensive process; and

WHEREAS, Congress needs to immediately reaffirm FLPMA's primary intent. Failure to act may have far-reaching consequences in Idaho, including encumbering the management of millions of acres across the West, along with threatening the certainty of other completed FLPMA land exchanges and disposals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Idaho Legislature strongly urges the Congress of the United States to, as expeditiously as possible, enact legislation reaffirming that FLPMA is the proper and primary avenue to facilitate effective federal land management and disposal, including by land exchange.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as intended by Congress and provided for in FLPMA, previous land disposal laws should

not be interpreted to conflict with or override FLPMA's disposal authority. Such expeditious action by Congress will prevent the West from being pushed back into the management chaos that Congress fixed in 1976 by enacting FLPMA.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Memorial to the President of the United States, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of Congress, the congressional delegations representing the states of Idaho, Utah, Nevada, and Wyoming in the Congress of the United States, the United States Attorney General, and the Secretary of the Interior.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 19
BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE**

A HOUSE RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, CONDEMNING POLITICAL VIOLENCE AND CRIMES AGAINST THE STATE THAT OCCURRED IN 2025, HONORING THE LIVES, LEADERSHIP, AND LEGACIES OF THE PUBLIC AND CIVIL SERVANTS AND POLITICAL ACTIVISTS WHO WERE KILLED OR INJURED, AND CALLING UPON ALL IDAHOANS, REGARDLESS OF BACKGROUND, PARTY AFFILIATION, OR CREED, TO REJECT ALL FORMS OF SUCH VIOLENCE.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the foundation of a free and civil society is the ability to engage in open and respectful political discourse without fear of violence or retribution; and

WHEREAS, reprehensible political violence and crimes against the state occurred in 2025 throughout the United States and in the State of Idaho; and

WHEREAS, political activist and leader Charles "Charlie" James Kirk was inexcusably and horribly murdered while speaking at a peaceful political event at Utah Valley University in Orem, Utah; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota State Representative Melissa Hortman and her husband Mark Hortman were stalked and ruthlessly murdered in their home as part of a strategic plan to kill elected officials in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, our own state is not immune from such acts of violence; and

WHEREAS, in 2025, Idaho law enforcement, first responders, public and civil servants, and elected officials were the subject of targeted attacks by those who wished harm upon them, thus eroding civility and creating a barrier between the people and their government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the House of Representatives, assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, that the Idaho House of Representatives hereby condemns these murders and the crimes targeting the state that occurred in 2025, commends and honors the dedicated law enforcement and emergency personnel for their tireless efforts in finding the suspects responsible for these horrific acts, and urges the courts to bring swift legal justice for all involved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Idaho House of Representatives honors the life, leadership, and legacy of the public and civil servants and political activists who were killed and calls upon all Idahoans, regardless of background, party affiliation, or creed, to reject all forms of political violence and

crimes against the state, to recommit to respectful debate, to uphold American values, and to respect and honor one another as fellow Americans.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the Idaho Legislature has invited all Idahoans to promote an awareness and understanding of the principles contained in the nation's founding documents, including representative government, personal responsibility, individual liberty, and equal and inalienable rights; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Legislature has encouraged Idahoans to reflect on American and state history and heritage, develop deeper connections within their communities, and advance Idaho's contributions and values for the benefit of our children and future generations; and

WHEREAS, Idaho is proudly joining the nation in celebrating America's 250th birthday by implementing America250 in Idaho, a statewide effort to honor our nation's founding, engage families and students, and create lasting memories for future generations; and

WHEREAS, using Spuddy Buddy, the official mascot of the Idaho Potato Commission, the Revolutionary Spud characters were created to honor historic revolutionary leaders, and each was given a personality as well as handcrafted costumes to make history fun, approachable, and unforgettable for Idahoans of all ages; and

WHEREAS, the Revolutionary Spuds are official America250 in Idaho ambassadors and have traveled thousands of miles throughout the state visiting community events and collecting signatures for the historic capitol rotunda Declaration of Independence; and

WHEREAS, thousands of Idahoans have already signed Idaho's replica of the Declaration of Independence, which hangs in the capitol rotunda; and

WHEREAS, "Forever Idaho" is the official theme song for America250 in Idaho ambassadors and the Revolutionary Spuds and was created as a gift for all Idahoans; and

WHEREAS, the song "Forever Idaho" celebrates Idaho's breathtaking landscapes, resilient communities, and shared love of home as we come together to honor America's 250th birthday and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the America250 in Idaho ambassadors are setting a bold vision and challenging Idahoans to collectively perform 250,000 acts of service from January until July 4, 2026, inviting every generation, from our youngest students to our wisest seniors, to join hands in this shared endeavor and fill our communities with hope and kindness.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Idaho Legislature declares 2026 to be the Year of Volunteerism and the America250 in Idaho Service Challenge.
