Year Over Year Data Points

Cases & Crime Types

15% increase in Cases Filed with CVCP between FY24 and FY25.

- FY24 2492 cases filed
- FY25 2874 cases filed

Top 4 Crime Types

1. Child Sexual Abuse is the top crime type year over year.
 - a. 1316 cases in FY25
 - b. 5% increase from FY24 to FY25
2. Adult Assault (example Intimate Partner Violence)
 - a. 612 cases in FY25
 - b. 10% increase from FY24 to FY25
3. Child Physical Abuse and Neglect
 - a. 402 cases in FY25
 - b. 65% increase from FY24 to FY25
 - c. This crime type moved up from #4 to #3.
4. Adult Sexual Assault
 - a. 343 cases in FY25
 - b. 35% increase from FY24 to FY25

Funds Paid Out to Victims/Providers:

General Fund Sexual Assault Appropriation \$294k prior to the 4% reduction; \$282k for FY26

- In FY25, 89% of the fund (\$261,165.00) was allocated to cover Sexual Assault Forensic Exams. This represents the highest annual expenditure from the fund since its establishment in 2018.
- Since July 1, 2025 - \$56,969.00 has been disbursed. Please note that CVCP must use \$50,000 from its federal grant for sexual assault forensic examinations before it can access appropriation funds.

Funding Sources:

- Fines paid on criminal convictions
 - Misdemeanors: \$37
 - Felonies: \$75
 - Sex Offenses: \$300
- Federal Grant: OVC VOCA Victim Compensation Formula Grant
- Financial Recovery: Restitution and Subrogation
- Donations
 - Independent Donors
 - State Victim Notification Fund
 - Prison Industry Enhancement Certification Program
- State of Idaho General Fund Appropriation: Sexual Assault Forensic and Medical Examination Costs.
 - Must first spend \$50k from dedicated/federal funds.
 - FY26: \$294,000.00
 - After 4% reduction: \$282,260.00

Eligibility Requirements:

- Crime must occur after 1986
- Crime must occur in Idaho
- Report to law enforcement within 72 hours of occurrence
 - Waivable with good cause
- Application filed within one year of the criminal incident
 - Waivable with good cause
- Claimant/Victim cooperation with law enforcement/prosecution
- Contribution
- Preponderance of Evidence
- Lawful Presence (July 1, 2025)
