**Chairman Redman** called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Thompson** made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 13, 2026 meeting. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

**H 750:** **Rep. Scott** presented **H 750**, explaining the legislation defines and regulates the use of "programmable money" in Idaho by excluding it from existing definitions of money under the Uniform Commercial Code and establishing a new framework to protect consumer payment rights. The bill limits the ability of issuers to control, restrict, or deny transactions based on lawful personal characteristics or activities, prohibits the use of social credit scoring through programmable money, and requires transparency when transactions are denied. It also provides civil remedies, attorney's fees, and criminal penalties to ensure enforcement while preserving the lawful use of digital assets and alternative forms of payment.

**Rep. Elaine Price** explained further about **H 750**, noting the remedies for those having transactions denied.

**Greg Graf** testified in support of **H 750**, noting experience in China and social credit scores. He also clarified stablecoin is not connected.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Harris** made a motion to send **H 750** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Scott** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Speaking to the motion, committee members noted the importance of this legislation to protect Idahoans, sharing concerns about situations around the world where citizens are being controlled by the ability to utilize digital currency.

**H 738:** **Rep. Dygert** presented **H 738**, explaining the legislation allows individuals forming an at home LLC would be allowed to not publish the home address on the Secretary of State website if they have a commercial registered agent physical address instead. No other part of forming an LLC would be affected.

Committee inquired regarding entity types of which the legislation applies.

**MOTION:** **Rep. Crane (12)** made a motion to send **H 738** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Dygert** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

**H 648:** **Rep. Bruce** presented **H 648**, explaining the purpose of the legislation is to create co-insurance parity for cancer treatment patient cost regardless of treatment being intravenously administered, injected, or orally taken. The legislation directs the Department of Insurance to ensure state regulated health plans, when anti-cancer medication is covered by a health plan, to provide patients access to orally administered anti-cancer medications at a co-insurance rate no more than the cost to access injected or intravenously administered medication

**MOTION:** **Rep. Crane (12)** made a motion to send **H 648** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Bruce** will sponsor the bill on the floor.
