- Chairman Skaug** called the meeting to order at 1:32pm.

- H 681:** **Rep. Stone** presented **H 681** regarding statute of limitations and felonies. **Brian Naugle**, Idaho Prosecuting Attorneys Association, testified **in support**. Committee inquired regarding application to AI generated child pornography.
- MOTION:** **Rep. Shirts** made a motion to send **H 681** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Stone** will sponsor the bill on the floor.
- Chairman Skaug** turned the gavel over to **Vice Chairman Alfieri**.
- H 822:** **Chairman Skaug** presented **H 822** regarding pediatric transitions and parental rights. **Erin Friday**, Our Duty-USA, **Kristina Hardy**, **Matt Sharp**, Alliance Defending Freedom, and **Edward Clark**, Idaho Family Policy Center, testified **in support**. **Nikson Matthews**, **Melissa Webb**, and **Sara LaWall**, Boise Universalist Fellowship, testified **in opposition**. Committee inquired regarding implementation, parent notification, definition of "aggrieved parent", reporting obligations due to changes in appearance or dress, repercussions on opt-in sex education, reasonableness of parent notice, health professional experiences, impacts on parent-child relationships, age at which children should be exploring sexual identities apart from parent knowledge, definition clarification of "parent" and "legal guardian", child abuse scenarios, excessive fines, limitations on parents aware of their child's gender transition, and comparable offenses currently in code.
