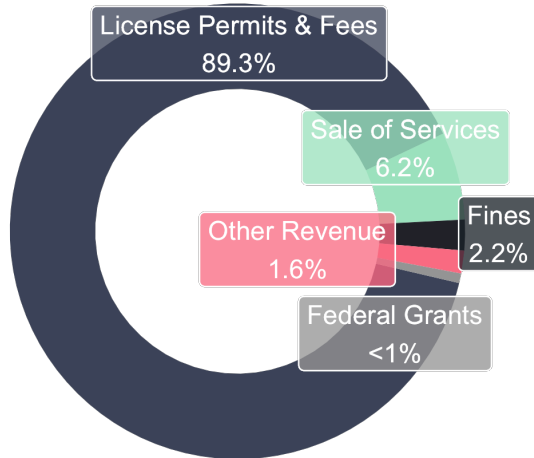




Agency Summary & Statutory Authority

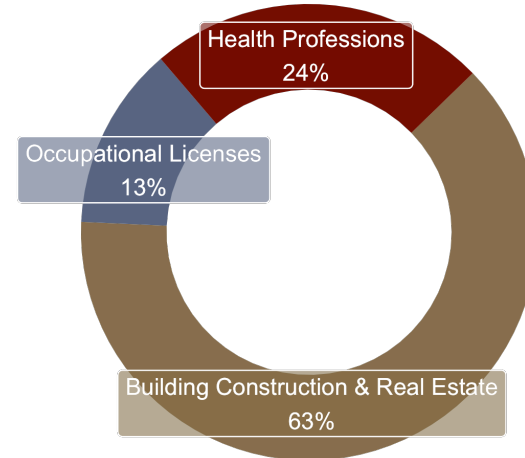
The Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses (DOPL) was created with the passage of H318 of 2020. Pursuant to Section 67-2601(2)(h), Idaho Code, the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses exists within the Department of Self-Governing Agencies. On June 3, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-10 reorganizing 11 agencies into one division with four bureaus that oversee 48 boards and commissions. There are four budgeted programs: Administration, Building Construction and Real Estate, Occupational Licenses, and Health Professions.

Agency Highlights

- The Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses is exempt from program transfer limitations found in Section 67-3511(2), Idaho Code.
- For FY 2022, the agency expended 88% of its total appropriation, of which 99.64% was from dedicated funds. There are no General Fund appropriations.
- There are three open audit findings to report.
